“Reading....How Hard Can It Be?”



In her presentation, Gretchen will discuss why she and Jeanine Phillips started the FUNdamental Learning Center and the overwhelming continuing need for its services. She expects our members to take away from this presentation a better understanding of:

- what dyslexia is and isn't and warning signs
- what it takes to learn to read
- the importance of effective and early intervention and instruction
- the resources and services provided by the Center

Gretchen Andeel was born and raised in Hays, Kansas. In 1963, she graduated from the University of Kansas with a BS in Education. Her teaching career spanned 7 years in St. Louis, Ann Arbor, and Wichita. She retired from teaching in 1970 when she and her husband adopted the first of their four children. In addition to her heavy involvement with her children and their school activities, she has been an active member of the Wichita Junior League and has served on many church and community boards and committees. In 2001 she and Jeanine Phillips co-founded the FUNdamental Learning Center, a not-for-profit, 501(c)(3) educational resource center with a mission to serve children with significant reading, spelling, and writing difficulties, including children with dyslexia.

Gretchen has been married to Rotarian Stan Andeel since 1964. They have four grown children and three grandchildren. She enjoys reading, cooking, and traveling.

RI President-Elect Ray Klinginsmith announced the new RI theme on January 18 during the opening plenary session of the 2010 International Assembly.

Klinginsmith said he arrived at the theme after reviewing RI themes of years past. He noticed that only a few spoke to non-Rotarians. “As a result, I decided to search for a briefly state theme that would fulfill two objectives: the first to explain Rotary to non-Rotarians, and the second to validate our work for Rotarians,” he said. “The words I have selected to describe Rotary’s current mission and to highlight our achievements are what we do best: **Building Communities - Bridging Continents.**”

The election of three WRCF Directors will be held on March 1, 2010.

Haiti Relief - How We Can Help

We have received several calls and emails in the Rotary Office about the status of our friends in Lambert, Haiti and how we can assist in relief efforts. Geri Appel and Sam Muyskens report that Lambert was not affected by the earthquake save for feeling the earth move.

From raising funds to collecting relief supplies to distributing life-saving shelters in Port-au-Prince, Rotary clubs worldwide continue to ramp up efforts to save lives. **Following are three Rotary related relief suggestions that have come our way:**

- ShelterBox:** Among the first international relief workers to reach Haiti were volunteers from ShelterBox, a U.K.-based disaster response organization supported by Rotary clubs worldwide. Each ShelterBox kit contains a 10-person tent, a water purification system and other survival necessities. About 2,000 ShelterBoxes - enough to assist 20,000 people - are in Haiti, and another 3,000 are due within a week. For more information or to make a donation, please see www.shelterbox.org.

- Rotary Foundation Haiti Earthquake Relief Fund:** Set up to streamline the flow of contributions from Rotarians looking to assist victims of the earthquake. The funds will work with local Rotary clubs and districts, as well as emergency relief agencies, to meet the most pressing needs of people in affected areas. The fund will make grants after consulting with District 7020 Governor Errol Alberga or his designee. Funds will be used in the relief effort and for projects providing longer-term support and development.
