### March 15 - Bill Moore, CEO Westar Energy "The Ever-Changing Electric Utility Industry"



Bill Moore is President, Chief Executive Officer and a Director of Westar Energy. He has worked for Westar Energy a total of 29 years.

Bill first joined Kansas Gas and Electric Company in Wichita in 1978 and held various positions within the Finance Department, eventually becoming Chairman of the Board and President of KG&E. He left the company in 2000 and served as a managing director for Saber Partners, LLC, New York. Bill returned to Westar Energy in December 2002 as Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer. In 2006 he became President and COO.

Bill graduated cum laude from Wichita State University, where he also played football. Bill is a member of the board, and has served in leadership positions of several civic and charitable organizations.

### March 22 - Brent Doonan "Surviving The Unthinkable"

Brent Doonan will discuss his journey of opening a stock trading office in Atlanta Georgia, building it into a successful business, and ultimately surviving the worst workplace shooting in U.S. history. Rotarians will have a first hand account of the events leading up to the deadly shooting and learn of a harrowing tale of survival.

Mr. Doonan graduated from Indiana University with a B.S. degree in Finance and Real Estate. He was the Co-Founder and President of All-Tech Direct in Atlanta, Georgia and is Vice President of Doonan Truck & Equipment in Wichita. He has appeared on *The Today Show*, NBC, ABC, and Fox news. Most recently he was featured on E! Television's 15 Most Shocking Acts of Violence. Brent is the author of the book *Murder at the Office*, and is featured in an upcoming release titled *Delivered from Evil-Stories of Surviving Harrowing Mass Murder*.
