**March 22 - Brent Doonan**

**“Surviving The Unthinkable”**



Brent Doonan will discuss his journey of opening a stock trading office in Atlanta Georgia, building it into a successful business, and ultimately surviving the worst workplace shooting in U.S. history. Rotarians will have a first hand account of the events leading up to the deadly shooting and learn of a harrowing tale of survival. Mr. Doonan graduated from Indiana University with a B.S. degree in Finance and Real Estate. He was the Co-Founder and President of All-Tech Direct in Atlanta, Georgia and is Vice President of Doonan Truck & Equipment in Wichita. He has appeared on *The Today Show*, NBC, ABC, and Fox news. Most recently he was featured on E! Television's 15 Most Shocking Acts of Violence. Brent is the author of the book *Murder at the Office*, and is featured in an upcoming release titled

*Delivered from Evil-Stories of Surviving Harrowing Mass Murder.*

**March 29 - H. David Wilson, MD**

**Dean, KU School of Medicine - Wichita**

H. David Wilson, MD, was named Dean of the KU School of Medicine-Wichita and Professor of Pediatrics in 2009. A pediatrician with fellowship training in infectious diseases, he was previously Dean and Professor of Pediatrics at the University of North Dakota School of Medicine & Health Sciences and Vice President for Health Affairs and a faculty member at the University of Kentucky College of Medicine, completing his tenure as Professor and Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, where he also served as Vice Chair of Pediatrics and Director of Admissions.

Dr. Wilson is a graduate of Wabash College and St. Louis University School of Medicine. He was a resident in pediatrics at the University of Kentucky and an NIH fellow at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School-Dallas. He also completed a sabbatical study in virology at the University of London Institute of Child Health and Hospital for Sick Children in London, England.

Dr. Wilson was selected as an American Council on Education (ACE) fellow mentored by President David Roselle at the University of Kentucky in 1988 and 1989. He has received several teaching awards, including the University of Kentucky Alumni Association's Great Teacher Award and the University of Kentucky College of Medicine Alumni's Commonwealth Award. He is a past chair of the American Medical Association's (AMA) Governing Council of the Section on Medical Schools. From 2002 to 2007, he served as chair of the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) Section on Community-Based Deans. He is the author of more than 50 peer-reviewed publications and one book. Dr. Wilson was elected by the AMA's House of Delegates to serve on their Council on Medical Education and was appointed to the Liaison Committee on Medical Education from 2001 to 2004. In 2007, Dr. Wilson was elected Chair of the AAMC Council of Deans.
