Upcoming Programs

August 30 - Daniel Hege - Conductor, Wichita Symphony "Podium Perspectives"



Daniel Hege is widely recognized as one of America's finest young conductors, earning critical acclaim for his fresh interpretations of the standard repertoire and for his commitment to creative programming. He begins his tenure with the Wichita Symphony Orchestra for their 2010-2011 Classics Series. Mr. Hege will reflect on the distinct duties as a "music director" and "conductor" for symphony orchestra as it evolves to satisfy 21st century audiences.

Following a nationwide search, Mr. Hege was named Music Director of the Syracuse Symphony Orchestra in April, 1999 and in 2003, led that symphony in a critically acclaimed concert at a sold-out Carnegie Hall. In June 2001, he completed his five year tenure with the Baltimore Symphony where he held the titles of Assistant, Associate and Resident Conductor and led the orchestra in subscription, family and

run-out concerts. He has also made three recordings - a disc with the Baltimore Symphony and the Morgan State University Choir featuring works by Adolphus Hailstork, a CD with the Syracuse Symphony with works by Verdi, Barber, Debussy, Respighi and James Johnson, and a CD with Rachel Barton Pine and the Encore Chamber Orchestra entitled Violin Concertos by Black Composers of the 18th and 19th Century on the Cedille label.

Mr. Hege has also served as Music Director of the Haddonfield (NJ) Symphony, Associate Conductor of the Kansas City Symphony, Music Director of the Encore Chamber Orchestra in Chicago and Music Director of the Chicago Youth Symphony where he was twice honored by the American Symphony Orchestra League for innovative programming.

Daniel Hege has guest conducted the Houston, Detroit, Seattle, Indianapolis, Oregon, Colorado, San Diego, Columbus and Phoenix symphonies; the Rochester, Buffalo and Calgary Philharmonics and at the Grand Teton and Aspen Music Festivals. International engagements include leading the Singapore Symphony and the St. Petersburg Symphony at the Winter Nights Festival.

Mr. Hege received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1987 from Bethel College, Kansas where he majored in music and history. He has received many advanced and honorary degrees as well. He currently resides in Syracuse with his wife, Katarina Oladottir Hege, a violinist, and their three daughters.
