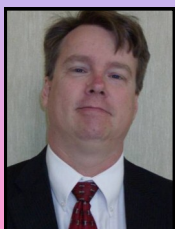
David received his Bachelor's Degree in Geography from Western University and his Master's Degree in Geography from Carleton University.

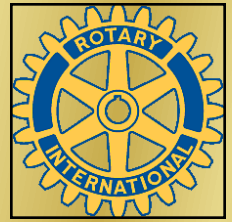

## Serving the Hungry: At Home and in Haiti

The Rotary Club of Wichita, in partnership with Global Faith in Action (ASAP Haiti Project), Numana and Volunteer Kansas are about to conduct the largest food packaging event in the history of Guinness World Records. On Saturday, February 16, from noon to 1:00 PM, **we will package enough food to feed the 800 children we have been supporting for the rest of this school year and all of next year. We will package 350,000 meals in 1 hour using 2,000 volunteers (5,384 meals per minute) at the Kansas Coliseum Pavilion II.** This is urgent business, because the children we have been helping have not received a noon meal since September 2012. Hurricanes Isaac and Sandy have devastated Haiti's crops. The U.S. farm belt has experienced severe drought causing a shortage of surplus food. And there is more! **Kansas families are experiencing hunger.** At the request of the Kansas Food Bank, we will ask each of the 2,000 volunteers to bring 2 cans of fruit which would provide 4,000 cans of fruit to be distributed by the Kansas Food Bank.

Want to help? Don't worry, over the next few weeks you will be given the opportunity! Mark your calendar to bring your family and friends out to help both our own community and our schools in Haiti on February 16.
