January 28 — David Barber, AICP, Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Department

Since 1999, David has been the Advanced Plans Division Manager with the Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Department. His staff is responsible for neighborhood, downtown and comprehensive planning initiatives in Wichita and unincorporated Sedgwick County. Current projects include the City of Wichita Bicycle Master Plan, implementation of the Downtown Master Plan, and creating a new joint comprehensive Plan for Wichita-Sedgwick County.

Prior to his current employment, David served for three years as the Planning Director for the Grand Island/Hall County Regional Planning Commission in Grand Island, Nebraska. He also has 20 years of municipal planning experience with various urban and rural municipalities in the Province of Alberta, Canada. David is a member of both the American Institute of Certified Planners and the Canadian Institute of Planners.

David received his Bachelor's Degree in Geography from Western University and his Master's Degree in Geography from Carleton University.

Diane led a GSE Team to Sao Paulo, Brazil in 1998. She also has a passion for RYLA and has served as both a counselor and RYLA Chair and has been active in three International RYLA conferences. In August of 2002, she chaired the first "Young RYLA" program for middle school students. She is excited about helping Rotary grow its membership. She is serving on her club's membership committee, and has served as a Regional Rotary International Membership Coordinator for Zone 25 from 2007-2010. She also loves to train and has trained Presidents at Presidents Elect Training (PETS), incoming Governors Elect and Nominee at Zone Institutes and Governors Elect from around the world at the International Assembly in San Diego in 2010 and 2011.

In one of her most memorable Rotary experiences, Diane participated in the Climb for Children 2000, a project of the Evergreen Rotary Foundation, where she raised over \$20,000 and climbed Mt. Kilimanjaro, the highest point in Africa, to benefit a hospital in Arusha, Tanzania. Diane was honored with Rotary International's Service above Self Award in 2002.

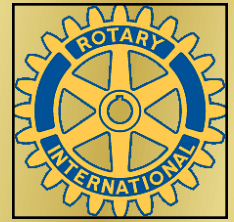
