April 8 — Jon Rolph — Sasnak Management

Jon Rolph was born and raised in Wichita. After graduating from Baylor University, he worked for the National Student Leadership Forum in Washington D.C. April 15 — Steven Van Zant — Case New Holland

Steven Van Zant is responsible for North America Manufacturing of construction equipment for CNH (Case New Holland) comprised of facilities in Calhoun, Georgia, Burlington, Iowa, and Wichita, Kansas. In addition, he serves in the role of Plant Manager in the Wichita facility. This facility is a recent recipient of Industry Week's "2012 IW Best Plants" recognition. Steven and his wife, Mary, located here from Calhoun, Georgia in 2012. In Georgia, he served as joint venture leader for the CNH/Kobelco manufacturing site, which

builds heavy excavators and dozers for North America, Latin America, Africa, and the Middle East regions.

Steven has worked in the heavy equipment business for the past 37 years, beginning with Caterpillar in E. Peoria, Illinois in their Manufacturing Operations Trainee program. Following a short stint as a machinist, he went on to hold roles in industrial and manufacturing engineering, and machine programming. After nine years, Steven joined J.I. Case Company, which through various business evolutions, has become one of the key legacy businesses of CNH America, LLC formed in 2000.

During his career with CNH, Steven has held numerous technical and management roles, including major facility conversion, product transfers, production general management, quality leadership, industrial management, and plant and division management. Born to Robert and Nancy Brownback, Sam grew up on the family farm near Parker, Kansas, and attended Prairie View High School. After graduating from Prairie View in 1974, Sam attended Kansas State University in Manhattan, where he received his degree in Agricultural Economics in 1978. Brownback earned his law degree from the University of Kansas Law School in 1982.

Brownback was elected to the House of Representatives in 1994 and to the U.S. Senate in 1996. During his time in the Senate, he served on the Appropriations Committee, the Agricultural Appropriations Subcommittee and the Homeland Security Subcommittee. In 2010, Brownback was elected the 46th governor of Kansas and took office in January, 2011.

If so, please consider nominating the student for a scholarship to the annual Rotary Youth Leadership Camp. Our club will sponsor 2 high school students to attend this unique educational venue. Relatives of Rotarians are welcome to apply!

The Rotary Youth Leadership Camp is an active community partnership between Rotary District #5690 and the Southwestern College Leadership program.

This year's theme "Ordinary Superheroes" will teach the campers the possibilities and responsibilities of being a leader in their school and in their community through servant leadership. The programs highlight what Rotary is doing in different communities and teaches hero-like traits to ordinary high school students.

The camp experience includes a team building day at a ropes course on the grounds of Camp Horizon; a group service project in Oxford, KS; a picnic mixer with Winfield Rotarians; leadership speakers and lessons; and special events like dodge ball, a cookout, movie night, swimming and more.

The camp will take place from May 25-May 29, 2013 on the Southwestern College campus in Winfield, KS. The cost is \$300, including housing and expenses. Scholarships, which may cover the full cost of the camp, are available through the Rotary Club of Wichita.
