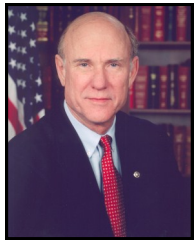

August 19 — U.S. Senator Pat Roberts — **Guest Reservations Required!**

U.S. Senator Pat Roberts was born in Topeka, graduated from Holton High School and went on to earn his journalism degree from Kansas State University. He proudly wears the purple to this day. For 16 years, he represented the Big First District, which included his home of Dodge City, in the U.S. House of Representatives. In 1996, Roberts was elected to the U.S. Senate where he is currently serving his third term.

Roberts is a senior member of the Senate Agriculture Committee. In the last Congress, he served as the ranking member, becoming the first in history to hold the post in both the House and the Senate. Roberts continues his work in the 113th Congress focusing on a variety of agricultural and economic issues.

Roberts was chairman of the House Agricultural Committee from 1995-1997, where he led the reform of outdated federal farm policies. He serves as a member of the Senate Finance Committee, where he provides Kansas with the opportunity to influence legislation ranging from taxes to trade, health care, Medicare, Social Security, the aviation industry and transportation.

As chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee for four years, Roberts worked to improve intelligence gathering and analysis capabilities at a critical time in our nation's history. When concerns arose regarding the timing and accuracy of U.S. intelligence on pre-war Iraq, he led the Intelligence Committee through one of the most exhaustive reviews of U.S. intelligence ever conducted. The bipartisan report, unanimously approved by the members of the Intelligence Committee, revealed systemic failures within the intelligence community. The review led Roberts to propose critical and forward-thinking intelligence reforms. Many of his proposals were included in the 9/11 Intelligence Reform Act of 2004. In 2004, he delivered the prestigious Landon Lecture at Kansas State University on national security topics.

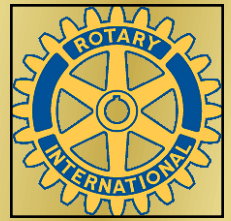
Roberts is also the Ranking Member of the Senate Rules Committee, expanding his duties to include oversight on general operations of the U.S. Senate and federal elections. Roberts and his wife, Franki, have three grown children – David, Ashleigh and Anne-Wesley, and five grandchildren.

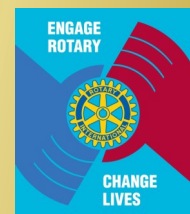

Calling Habitat for Humanity Volunteers

Online registration **IS OPEN** for the Downtown Rotary Club's Habitat for Humanity build. Sign up for 6-hour shifts, 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday, October 8 through November 2.

To start, follow this link to the Habitat Construction Volunteer Page at [Construction Volunteer Registration](http://volunteerup.com/Login.asp?w=i&o=80) or <http://volunteerup.com/Login.asp?w=i&o=80>.

There are two simple steps to the process:

Step one: Register as a volunteer. Keep it simple by filling the required data fields only. These are marked with an asterisk. You will have to state your relationship with Downtown Rotary two times. Check the associated box in the list of registered groups and answer the question "Are you registering with a group?" by typing "Downtown Rotary" or "Downtown Rotary Women."

Step two: Select build dates. Wichita Rotary Women (WRW) have selected Saturday October 12 as a women-only build. Women are also welcome on any other day! Hospitality volunteer positions are available during morning check-in and over lunch hour if construction is truly not your thing.
