September 9 — Jerry Traylor — Corporate Motivational Speaker

Born with cerebral palsy, Jerry Traylor faced physical pain and loneliness that few children ever know. People in his life empowered Jerry to set goals and achieve greatness in spite of his disabilities. His example compels many to look at their own lives and take positive action.

On crutches, Jerry has: skied down Colorado mountains, competed in 35 full-length marathons, parachuted from an altitude of 12,500 feet, climbed to the 14,110-foot top of Pike's Peak, participated in 16 dance marathons for charity, and jogged 3,528 miles from San Francisco to New York City.

For the past 30 years, Jerry has inspired more than 1 million people in 49 states and abroad as an inspirational and unique public speaker. He has spoken for company giants IBM and DuPont, for smaller companies, and for schools, community groups and many service clubs.

During his "Run Across America," Jerry was hosted by various groups and service clubs who initiated projects benefiting the elderly and disabled in communities through which he ran. He recently authored the book "LiveCAREfully ... The Importance of CARING in a Life of Significance."



September 16 — Scott Ernest — President & CEO — Cessna Aircraft

Scott A. Ernest became president and chief executive officer of Cessna Aircraft Company, the world's leading general aviation company, on May 31, 2011. Headquartered in Wichita, Kansas, Cessna has produced nearly 200,000 aircraft since its founding in 1927, including more than 6,500 Citations, making it the largest fleet of business jets in the world.

A native of Kansas, Scott has nearly three decades of aviation experience. He joins Cessna after a 29-year career at GE where he worked at GE Aviation, a \$16 billion provider of jet engines, components and integrated systems for commercial and military aircraft.

Scott left GE Aviation as vice president and general manager of global supply chain, a role he accepted in 2003. Previously, he was vice president and general manager of global operations for engine services, having been appointed to that position as well as being named an officer of General Electric Company, in 2001.

An active supporter of the United Way, Scott has led several campaign initiatives throughout his career both at Cessna and for the broader United Way community. His leadership has yielded a more than 20 percent increase in Cessna employee giving to the United Way.

Scott has a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Akron and a master's degree in engineering from the University of Cincinnati.

Cessna has two principal lines of business: aircraft sales and aftermarket services. Aircraft sales include Citation business jets, Caravan single-engine utility turboprops, single-engine piston aircraft and lift solutions by CitationAir. Aftermarket services include parts, maintenance, inspection and repair services. In 2012, Cessna delivered 571 aircraft, including 181 Citation business jets, and reported revenues of \$3.1 billion.
