September 16 — Scott Ernest — President & CEO — Cessna Aircraft

Scott A. Ernest became president and chief executive officer of Cessna Aircraft Company, the world's leading general aviation company, on May 31, 2011. Headquartered in Wichita, Kansas, Cessna has produced nearly 200,000 aircraft since its founding in 1927, including more than 6,500 Citations, making it the largest fleet of business jets in the world.

A native of Kansas, Scott has nearly three decades of aviation experience. He joins Cessna after a 29-year career at GE where he worked at GE Aviation, a \$16 billion provider of jet engines, components and integrated systems for commercial and military aircraft.

Scott left GE Aviation as vice president and general manager of global supply chain, a role he accepted in 2003. Previously, he was vice president and general manager of global operations for engine services, having been appointed to that position as well as being named an officer of General Electric Company, in 2001.

An active supporter of the United Way, Scott has led several campaign initiatives throughout his career both at Cessna and for the broader United Way community. His leadership has yielded a more than 20 percent increase in Cessna employee giving to the United Way.

Scott has a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Akron and a master's degree in engineering from the University of Cincinnati.

Cessna has two principal lines of business: aircraft sales and aftermarket services. Aircraft sales include Citation business jets, Caravan single-engine utility turboprops, single-engine piston aircraft and lift solutions by CitationAir. Aftermarket services include parts, maintenance, inspection and repair services. In 2012, Cessna delivered 571 aircraft, including 181 Citation business jets, and reported revenues of \$3.1 billion. September 23 — Todd Butler — Wichita State University Baseball Coach

Todd Butler became the head coach at Wichita State University in June of 2013. He comes to the Shockers after spending the past eight seasons as the hitting instructor, outfield coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville, Arkansas.

Butler is known around the country for his ability to attract the best talent and develop strong hitters. In his eight seasons at Arkansas, he helped the Razorbacks reach two College World Series appearances, eight NCAA regional berths, three NCAA super regional appearances and two SEC Western Division titles.

Prior to coming to Fayetteville, Butler completed two assistant coaching stints (eight total years) at the University of Alabama and three years as the head coach at his alma mater, McNeese State.

Butler earned his bachelor's degree in liberal studies from McNeese State in 1991, where he began his coaching career as a student assistant coach. Before joining the University of Alabama coaching staff, he served as an assistant coach there in 1993 and 1994.

During his first stint with the University of Alabama Crimson Tide from 1995-2000, Butler served as the hitting instructor and outfielders coach. He helped guide Alabama to six NCAA Regional appearances, as well as three trips to the College World Series in 1996, 1997 and 1999.

In 2001, Butler took over as head coach at McNeese State, where he compiled a 90-83 (.520) overall record in three seasons.

Butler returned to Alabama as an assistant baseball coach in June, 2003. He spent the 2004 and 2005 seasons on the Crimson Tide staff as the recruiting coordinator, hitting instructor and infield coach, while also coaching first base.

Born on July 23, 1966, in Alexandria, Louisiana, Todd and his wife, Melissa, have two daughters, Caitlyn (15) and Kendyll (10).
