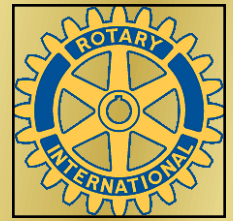

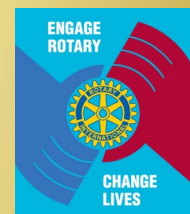

October 7 — U. S. Congressman Mike Pompeo

Congressman Mike Pompeo is a second-term Congressman from the 4th District. As a teenager, he enrolled at the United States Military Academy at West Point. He graduated first in his class in 1986 and then served as a cavalry officer patrolling the Iron Curtain before the fall of the Berlin Wall. He also served with the 2nd Squadron, 7th Cavalry in the Fourth Infantry Division.

After earning a law degree from Harvard Law School, Pompeo returned to his roots in Kansas and founded Thayer Aerospace, where he served as CEO for more than a decade, providing components for commercial and military aircraft. He then became President of Sentry International, an oilfield equipment manufacturing, distribution and services company.

Pompeo serves on two major committees in the House of Representatives: Energy and Commerce, which oversees energy, health care, manufacturing and telecommunications, and the House Intelligence Committee, which oversees America's intelligence-gathering efforts. In Congress, he has been at the center of debates regarding fiscal responsibility and regulatory boundaries, particularly with respect to production, agriculture and small business.

Mike and his wife Susan are active leaders in the Wichita community.

Steve Martinez considers himself one of the luckiest men on earth. Three years ago he suffered from an e coli infection which caused all his vital organs to shut down. His body temperature soared to 107 degrees and stayed there. As he lay in a coma, doctors told his wife, Linda, to expect the worst.

When Steve eventually woke up, he found himself facing a new reality. The effects of the infection cost him both his legs, a thumb and three fingers. He worked with a physical therapist to learn to deal with his disabilities. Steve is currently employed by Dillon's as a store manager in Wichita at the 37th St. and Woodlawn location.

Throughout the experience, Steve never considered depression or self pity an option, rather feeling a profound sense of gratitude for his survival. He frequently speaks to cancer survivors and other groups of people suffering from illness or disabilities. He has made many inspirational presentations for organizations including Goodwill Industries, New York Life, the Kroger Co. and McConnell Air Force Base.

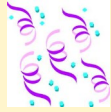
Steve lives in Harper, Kansas, with his wife and 26 horses. He attended the Pasadena City College in California and graduated from Cal State with a degree in business.
