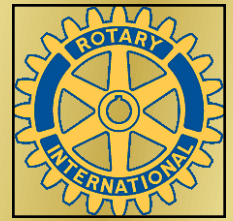

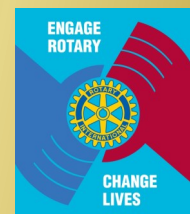

### October 28 — Maura McEnaney — Author of Willard Garvey Biography

Maura McEnaney has more than 30 years of experience as an award-winning business writer and editor. She is a former journalist at *Bloomberg News*, the *Akron Beacon Journal* and other regional daily and weekly newspapers and trade publications. Her work has appeared in the *Washington Post*, *Denver Post*, *Boston Globe*, *New York Daily News* and *Business Week* online.

McEnaney was a staff writer on the *Akron Beacon Journal's* "A Question of Color," a year-long project examining race relations in Akron, which won the Pulitzer Prize Gold Medal for Meritorious Public Service in 1994.

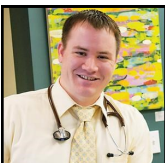
Several months after graduating from Syracuse University in 1979, McEnaney was working in Nevada as a young journalist when she first encountered Wichita's Garvey family, including the late patriarch Willard Garvey. She has been a close friend of his family for more than three decades.

The Garvey family commissioned McEnaney to write a biography of Willard Garvey and she spent five years researching his life. During the course of her research, she interviewed multiple Wichita residents who knew and worked closely with Garvey during his storied business career. The book, entitled *Willard Garvey: An Epic Life*, was published this year by LibertyTree Press.

Willard Garvey was a long-time active member of the Rotary Club of Wichita.

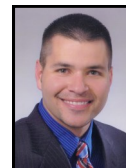
### November 4 — Dr. Josh Umbehr / Dr. Doug Nunamaker — AtlasMD

AtlasMD is Wichita's first concierge medical practice, established to provide family health care that is immediate, easily affordable and very personal. Concierge medicine is defined as a relationship between a patient and a primary care physician, in which the patient pays an annual fee or retainer.



Dr. Umbehr was raised in Alma, Kansas, and attended Kansas State University where he obtained his undergraduate degree in human nutritional sciences. He graduated from the University of Kansas School of Medicine and completed his family medicine residency at Wesley Medical Center. After completing his training and becoming a board certified family physician, he opened AtlasMD. Dr. Umbehr resides in Wichita with his wife Lisa and their three children, Katelyn, Paige and Cole.

Dr. Nunamaker was born in Joplin, Missouri, and raised in Manhattan, Kansas. He attended Pittsburg State University and graduated magna cum laude with a bachelor of science degree. He graduated from the University of Kansas School of Medicine and completed his residency at Wesley Family Medicine. After his residency, Dr. Nunamaker joined Mid-Kansas Inpatient Physicians as a hospitalist before joining AtlasMD. He resides in Wichita with his wife and son.
