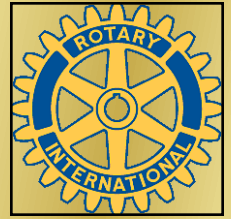

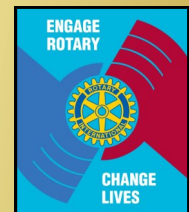

November 25 — Colonel James Dermer — Vice Commander, 22nd Air Refueling Wing, McConnell Air Force Base

Col. James Dermer is the Vice Commander of the 22nd Refueling Wing at McConnell AFB in Wichita. In this role, he assists the commander in providing all-weather, in-flight aerial refueling for United States and allied military aircraft, as well as Global Reach airlift for the rapid and precise projection of troops, equipment and supplies worldwide.

Col. Dermer is a command pilot with more than 3,300 flight hours in the T-37, T-1A, KC-135, C-21A and C-20H. He has flown combat and combat support missions during Operation NORTHERN WATCH, Operation SOUTHERN WATCH, Operation JOINT FORGE, Operation NOBLE EAGLE, Operation ENDURING FREEDOM, and Operation UNIFIED PROTECTOR.

Col. Dermer served in a variety of positions at the squadron, group and wing levels, as well as a position with the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's Allied Air Component Command Headquarters. He has commanded three squadrons including the Air Expeditionary Refueling Squadron.

The colonel holds a Bachelors of Political Science from the U.S. Air Force Academy, a Masters of Aerospace Science Technology from Embry Riddle University, a Masters of Transportation Management from the Air Force Institute of Technology at Wright-Patterson AFB and a Masters of Strategic Studies from the U.S. Army War College.



December 2 — Cary Conover — Freelance Photojournalist and Educator

Cary Conover is a freelance editorial photojournalist and photography educator based in Wichita, Kansas. From 2000 to 2010, he lived in New York City, where he shot breaking news and feature assignments for such publications as The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal and the Village Voice. In addition to his steady job of teaching photojournalism at Andover High School, Cary is an adjunct instructor at Wichita State University, Butler Community College and Friends University. A 1996 graduate of Kansas State University, Cary brings a candid, documentary approach to his photography, unobtrusively capturing moments like the seasoned photojournalist that he is.

Cary is the author of "Black Book: A Visual Diary" and his work is included in "Here Is New York: A Democracy of Photographs," which was published in the aftermath of 9/11. Cary has had some solo and group exhibitions of his black and white documentary street photography and has been featured extensively on various photography websites and magazines. He lives in College Hill with his wife, Yvonne, and their two-year-old son, Julian.

Hellen Haag received her 10-year pin from President Gayle. Congratulations, Hellen.

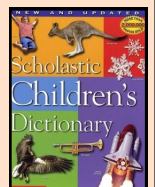
SEASON OF SERVICE
