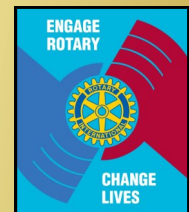

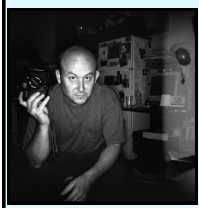

December 2 — Cary Conover — Freelance Photojournalist and Educator

Cary Conover is a freelance editorial photojournalist and photography educator based in Wichita, Kansas. A 1992 graduate of Southeast High School, he earned his B.A. in journalism and mass communications from Kansas State University in 1996. That same year, Cary went to work at a small daily newspaper, the Monroe Evening News, located in Monroe, Michigan. From 2000 to 2010, he lived in New York City, where he shot breaking news and feature assignments for such publications as The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal and The Village Voice. Cary has shot commissions for nonprofit organizations such as the Natural Resources Defense Council, and his work is included in the collection of The Museum of the City of New York.

In addition to his job teaching photojournalism at Andover High School, Cary is an adjunct instructor at Wichita State University, Butler Community College and Friends University. He spends part of every summer teaching photography at numerous high school and college journalism workshops. Cary is the author of "Black Book: A Visual Diary" and his work is included in "Here Is New York: A Democracy of Photographs," which was published in the aftermath of 9/11. He has had both solo and group exhibitions of his black and white documentary street photography and has been featured extensively on various photography websites and magazines. Cary lives in College Hill with his wife, Yvonne, and their two-year-old son, Julian.

December 9 – Friends University Singing Quakers — Guest reservations required by December 5

Singing has been at the heart of the Friends University experience since the university's inception. Founded in 1925, the Friends University Singing Quakers is the oldest musical organization at the university and performs a wide range of choral and musical theatre repertoire, as well as choral-orchestral masterworks with the Wichita

Symphony Orchestra. The Singing Quakers tour regularly, both in the United States and internationally, and as one of six choral ensembles at the university, the choir is part of a comprehensive vocal program. As part of the 90th anniversary year of the Singing Quakers (2014-15) the choir will mount a performance and service tour to Costa Rica in May, 2015.

Dr. Mark Bartel is in demand as a versatile conductor and music educator. This season he begins his ninth year as Director of Choral Music at Friends University and Conductor of the Singing Quakers, where he oversees a program of six choirs. In July 2010, he was appointed Artistic Director and Conductor of the Wichita Chamber Chorale, which is the third artistic director in the choir's history.

A native of Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario, Dr. Bartel's career has taken him to several cities in the United States and Canada. He has held faculty positions at Hobart and William Smith Colleges, Geneva, N.Y.; the University of Western Ontario, London, Ontario; and Canadian Mennonite University in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Since arriving in Wichita, Dr. Bartel has led his choirs in several performances at Kansas Music Educators Association and regional American Choral Directors Association conventions. He has toured with the Singing Quakers throughout the United States, Canada and Germany. In addition to the Singing Quakers, Dr. Bartel conducts the Chamber Choir and Choral Union, and teaches applied voice and conducting at Friends University.

Dr. Bartel is a recipient of the Canada Council's prestigious Sir Ernest Macmillan Prize in Conducting. He holds the Master of Music and Master of Sacred Music degrees from Southern Methodist University in Dallas, TX, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N.Y.

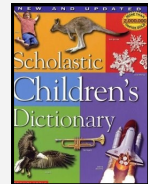
