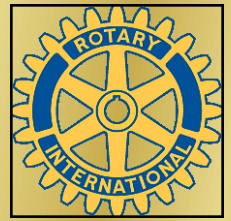

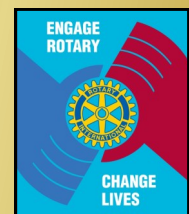

#### January 13 – Dr. Robert Lindsted – Superintendent – Sunrise Christian Academy

Robert Lindsted, Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering, taught for nine years in the Dept. of Mechanical Engineering at Wichita State University. As an engineering consultant, he worked with more than 100 companies on various products. Since leaving the University in 1979, Lindsted has been devoted full time to religious activities. He has spoken at Bible and prophecy conferences as well as youth camps in more than 35 U.S. states, plus Canada, Burma, China, Scotland, Jamaica & the Bahamas.

Dr. Lindsted especially enjoys working with young people and is currently the superintendent of Sunrise Christian Academy in Bel Aire. The Academy now enrolls more than 850 students from pre-kindergarten to 12th grade, and includes a childcare facility for ages 1-4.

Lindsted took his first trip to the former Soviet Union in 1991. The conditions and spiritual hunger he witnessed there inspired him to form the Christian missionary group *Milk and Honey Ministries*. This group has since expanded into Communist China. In the last few years, the ministry has taken another step by helping to start international Christian schools. Lindsted was born and raised in Kansas. He and his wife Sharon have 3 children and 9 grandchildren.

The topic of Dr. Lindsted's presentation will be the Sunrise men's basketball program. As reported in the November edition of the *East Wichita News*, although Sunrise is a small school with just 51 students in its senior class and total enrollment of 180, it is attracting national and even international attention for its play on the basketball court. Many Division I head or assistant coaches have visited Sunrises' campus with an eye toward recruiting, including Rick Pitino from the University of Louisville, Tom Izzo from Michigan State University and Bill Self from Kansas University. Izzo, Pitino and Wichita State University Head Coach Gregg Marshall have each received an oral commitment from a Sunrise player. #### January 27 — ACT ICT Community Vision Panel and Process Panel

As part of a year-long process to identify the community's priorities for now and future generations, the City of Wichita launched ACT ICT to listen directly to the citizens of Wichita. City Manager Bob Layton, Planning Director John Schlegel and the Associate Director of the Hugo Wall School of Public Affairs at Wichita State University, Misty Bruckner, will provide a brief update on some of the important issues facing our city and lead us through an individual prioritization process.

Bob Layton became Wichita's City Manager on Feb. 2, 2009, and has worked in local government management for more than 30 years. He reports to a seven-member city council and oversees more than 3,000 employees. Layton manages a \$500 million annual budget and a \$2 billion capital improvements program.

John Schlegel, Director of Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Department, oversees the operation of the consolidated department that provides planning for the city. Schlegel came to Wichita in 2003 with more than 29 years in local government, business, and real estate planning.

Misty Bruckner, the Associate Director of the Hugo Wall School of Public Affairs, joined Wichita State University in 2006. She is responsible for leading the school's outreach efforts in assisting local governments and nonprofit organizations with policy development, community surveys and professional development.
