KWCH to live stream Naturalization Ceremony

WICHITA, KS January 29, 2014 – Almost 100 people from 36 countries will become citizens of the United States Monday, February 3, 2014. The Rotary Club of Wichita and KWCH 12 invite all Kansans to welcome our nation's newest citizens.

The Naturalization Ceremony begins at 7 p.m. at INTRUST Bank Arena. The ceremony is free and the first 3,000 guests to arrive will receive pocket-size constitutions, courtesy of U.S. Representative Mike Pompeo.

As media sponsors for the event, KWCH 12 and KDCU 31 will live stream the ceremony on www.KWCH.com. This is an ideal opportunity for Kansas' students and those outside of the Wichita area to watch the ceremony from home.

The rare honor to witness a naturalization ceremony is not afforded to many people and for those individuals being naturalized, it will indeed be a historic day.

The ceremony brings together several community entities to recognize and celebrate the prestigious privilege and accomplishment of these new Americans. Event sponsors include: Rotary Club of Wichita, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services and the U.S. District Court.
