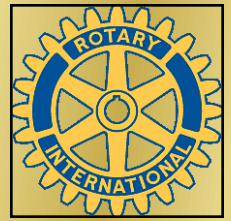

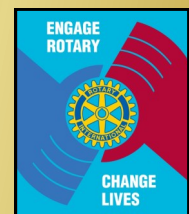

February 24 — Marc Bennett — Sedgwick County District Attorney

Marc Bennett served in the Sedgwick County district attorney's office for 15 years before his election to the office of district attorney in 2012. Prior to 2012, he served as deputy district attorney and supervised the Trial Division II, which encompassed the prosecution of sex crimes, human trafficking, domestic violence and elder abuse.

Bennett currently serves on the board of directors of the Kansas County and District Attorneys Association (KCDAA) and acts as the sex crime section chief for the organization. He is a member of the board of directors of the Wichita Area Sexual Assault Center (WASAC), the Sedgwick County Child Advocacy Center, the Kansas Attorney General's Human Trafficking Advisory Board (HTAB), and a faculty member of Finding Words Kansas. In addition, Bennett is an appointee to the Kansas Prosecutor's Grievance and Ethics Committee.

Bennett completed his undergraduate degree in history from Kansas State University and his juris doctor degree from Washburn University. He has been a regular presenter to the Kansas legislature and child advocacy forums and symposiums throughout the U.S. on the topic of protecting children from sexual crimes and abuse.

Marc grew up in Goddard playing bluegrass music with his dad and uncles. He lives in Cheney with his wife, Tamara, and their three daughters.



March 3 — Bob Lida — Masters Track and Field Athlete

A native of Kansas City, Bob moved to Wichita in 1964, and established Lida Advertising Company in 1979. He continues working with selected clients today, and also manages a new business enterprise, Original Skin, which specializes in affordable tattoo removable, hair removal and teeth whitening.

Bob began his track career during the glory years at the University of Kansas. With a cast of Olympian teammates that included Wes Santee, Al Orter, Billy Mills and Cliff Cushman, he won three Big 8 titles.

Bob resumed competing at age 40 in Masters Track and Field. After competing in the 1976 World Championships in Gutenberg, Sweden, for some unexplained reason, he switched from sprinting to marathons and road racing. At age 45, he completed the Chicago Marathon in two hours fifty seven minutes. Bob returned to sprinting at age 60, and has since won 21 World Masters Championships, 50 United States Track and Field Masters National Championships and 18 Senior Games Championships.

In 2012, Bob established 5 new world age group records in the 60, 100, 200 and 400 meters. In addition, he is a member of relay teams which currently hold 4 world age group records. Bob also holds 14 American age group records.

Bob currently coaches sprints and cross country at Kapaun-Mt. Carmel High School and conducts a year-around conditioning program for his student athletes. He credits his coaching experience for much of his success in World Masters Athletics, as he has incorporated the workout regime and sprinting mechanics he teaches into his own training program.

Bob was honored in 2012 by the World Masters Association as the Best Male Masters athlete in the world. He is only the third American to receive this recognition. In addition, Bob is a member of the University of Kansas Sports Hall of Fame and was elected to the United States Track and Field Masters Hall of Fame in 2009 and the World Masters Association Hall of Fame in 2012.

Bob is a 30 year Rotarian and has 3 children and 5 grandchildren.
