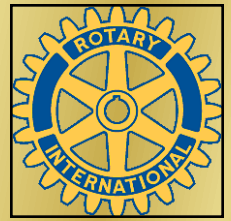

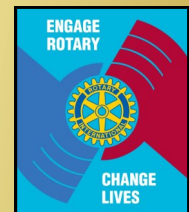

March 17 — Patrick Joseph O'Connor — Author, Historian, Musician

Patrick Joseph O'Connor is a Wichita native who has always been interested in Kansas history, including the counterculture and neighborhoods in Wichita.

In 2007, O'Connor's interest in Kansas history drew to his attention the fact that an important first-hand account of early Kansas from territorial to statehood days was long out of print. Written by James R. Mead, the book was entitled *Hunting and Trading on the Great Plains, 1859-1875*. Finding that the original publisher had no interest in reprinting the volume, O'Connor arranged permission to bring out a paperback edition in 2008. The book attracted so much attention that in 2011, the State Library of Kansas listed it as one of the Sesquicentennial 150 Best Books about Kansas. At present count, O'Connor has published six books, all concerned with various aspects of Kansas history.

O'Connor holds a masters of arts in communication from Wichita State University and was recently named a fellow in the Royal Geographical Society. He is an accomplished performing musician playing piano and guitar. He has a keen interest in the history of the blues, and has taught a class on the subject at Wichita State University.

As an author, he has published no less than 16 papers in learned journals, most of them chronicling various periods of popular music and famous musicians of the era concerned. He has also been invited to write articles for the *American National Biography* and *The New Grove Dictionary of American Music*.

O'Connor will speak on the Irish community in the early days of Wichita. Come ready for some St. Patrick's Day entertainment and a special surprise guest!



March 24 — Dr. Douglas Girod — Executive Vice Chancellor at the Kansas University Medical Center

Douglas A. Girod, M.D., became executive vice chancellor of the University of Kansas Medical Center and interim executive dean of the University of Kansas School of Medicine on Feb. 1, 2013. He oversees the educational, research, patient care and community engagement missions of the University of Kansas Schools of Medicine, Nursing and Health Professions, with their total annual enrollment of more than 3,362 students, a workforce of more than 3,300 faculty and staff, external research funding of nearly \$133 million, campuses in Kansas City, Wichita and Salina, Kansas, and activities in every county in the state of Kansas, as well as in western Missouri and elsewhere in the country and internationally.

Prior to becoming executive vice chancellor, Girod served as Senior Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs and chair of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. A surgeon, Girod joined the University of Kansas Medical Center faculty in 1994 and quickly rose through the academic ranks, becoming chair of the Otolaryngology department in 2002. He was named Russell E. Bridwell Endowed Chair in 2008. In his role as the chair of the Otolaryngology department, his leadership was instrumental in four years' worth of U.S. News & World Report "Best Hospitals, Ear, Nose and Throat" national rankings for The University of Kansas Hospital.

Girod earned his bachelor's degree in chemistry from the University of California at Davis and his medical degree from the University of California at San Francisco. He completed his residency and an National Institutes of Health (NIH) research fellowship at the University of Washington in Seattle. Prior to joining the University of Kansas Medical Center, Girod served as Vice Chairman and Research Director in the Department of Otolaryngology at the Naval Medical Center in Oakland, California.
