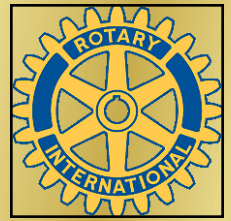

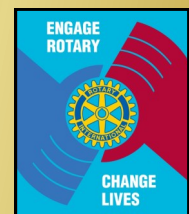

May 12 — Ray Roberts — Secretary, Kansas Department of Corrections

Roberts was appointed Secretary of Corrections by Governor Sam Brownback effective January 21, 2011.

Secretary Roberts was formerly the warden of El Dorado Correctional Facility, a position he had held since 2003. He began his career as a correctional officer at the Mississippi State Penitentiary in 1975. Since then he has served as a correctional counselor, staff development coordinator, deputy warden, director of faith-based ministry, warden of five correctional facilities and deputy secretary of facility management. He joined the Kansas Department of Corrections as the deputy warden of operations at Lansing Correctional Facility in 1988.

Roberts earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Southern Mississippi in Hattiesburg, MS, and his masters of education degree in counseling and guidance from Delta State University in Cleveland, MS.



May 19 — Dan Glickman — Vice President, Aspen Institute and Executive Director of the Aspen Institute Congressional Program **Guest Reservations Required**

Dan Glickman is former U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, Vice President of the Aspen Institute and Executive Director of the Aspen Institute Congressional Program. He co-chairs the Chicago Council on Global Affairs Initiative on Global Food Security. He is also a Senior Fellow at the Bipartisan Policy Center, a Washington, D.C. organization, founded by the last four senate majority leaders, Senators Bob Dole, Tom Daschle, Howard Baker and George Mitchell, to promote bipartisan solution to the nation's problems, including the national debt, immigration, housing and financial reform. Most of these efforts at both Aspen Institute and Bipartisan Policy Center are focused on ways to make our national political system work better and reduce the level of political gridlock in America. Glickman is also a member of the board of directors of the Chicago Mercantile Exchange and co-chair of AGree, an effort of the largest private foundations of America to examine long-term food and agricultural policy.

Prior to joining the Aspen Institute, Glickman served as U.S. Secretary of Agriculture in the Clinton administration from 1995 to 2001. He also represented the 4th Congressional District of Kansas, which included Wichita, for 18 years from 1977 to 1995, in the U.S. House of Representatives. Here he served on the House Agriculture Committee, where he was very involved in federal farm policy. He also served on the House Judiciary Committee and as chairman of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence.

Previously, Glickman served as chairman of the Motion Picture Association of America, Inc. and director of the Institute of Politics at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. He has served as president of the Wichita school board and was a partner in the law firm of Sargent, Klenda and Glickman, and has worked as a trial attorney at the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

Glickman received his bachelor's degree in history from the University of Michigan and his law degree from The George Washington University. He is a member of the Kansas and District of Columbia bars. Dan is married to Rhoda Glickman and they have two children and four grandchildren.

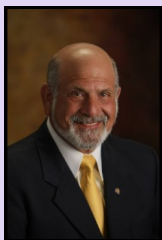
