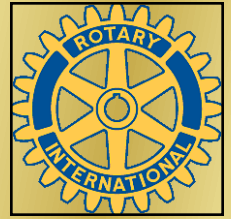

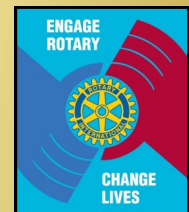

#### **May 19 — Dan Glickman — Vice President, Aspen Institute and Executive Director of the Aspen Institute Congressional Program**

Dan Glickman is former U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, Vice President of the Aspen Institute and Executive Director of the Aspen Institute Congressional Program. He co-chairs the Chicago Council on Global Affairs Initiative on Global Food Security. He is also a Senior Fellow at the Bipartisan Policy Center, a Washington, D.C. organization, founded by the last four senate majority leaders, Senators Bob Dole, Tom Daschle, Howard Baker and George Mitchell, to promote bipartisan solution to the nation's problems, including the national debt, immigration, housing and financial reform. Most of these efforts at both Aspen Institute and Bipartisan Policy Center are focused on ways to make our national political system work better and reduce the level of political gridlock in America. Glickman is also a member of the board of directors of the Chicago Mercantile Exchange and co-chair of AGree, an effort of the largest private foundations of America to examine long-term food and agricultural policy.

Prior to joining the Aspen Institute, Glickman served as U.S. Secretary of Agriculture in the Clinton administration from 1995 to 2001. He also represented the 4th Congressional District of Kansas, which included Wichita, for 18 years from 1977 to 1995, in the U.S. House of Representatives. Here he served on the House Agriculture Committee, where he was very involved in federal farm policy. He also served on the House Judiciary Committee and as chairman of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence.

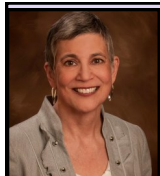
Previously, Glickman served as chairman of the Motion Picture Association of America, Inc. and director of the Institute of Politics at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. He has served as president of the Wichita school board and was a partner in the law firm of Sargent, Klenda and Glickman, and has worked as a trial attorney at the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

Glickman received his bachelor's degree in history from the University of Michigan and his law degree from The George Washington University. He is a member of the Kansas and District of Columbia bars. Dan is married to Rhoda Glickman and they have two children and four grandchildren.

#### **June 2 — Kansas Senate President Susan Wagle**

Kansas State Senator Susan Wagle was sworn in as the 47th Kansas Senate President on January 14, 2013. She is currently serving her fourth term in the Kansas Senate, representing the eastern part of Wichita. She is the first woman to serve as a top legislative leader in the state.

Wagle first came to Topeka in 1990 as a member of the State House of Representatives. She quickly became a key Republican leader, rising to become the first woman to ever serve as Speaker Pro Tem by 1994. During her tenure in the House, Wagle received the Guardian of Small Business award from the National Federation of Independent Business and the Friend of Business award from the Kansas Chamber of Commerce.

In 2000, Wagle was elected to the state senate. Before elected by her peers to serve as Senate President, she chaired the Senate's Public Health and Welfare committee, the Healthcare Strategies committee and Commerce committee.

Wagle graduated from Wichita State University in 1979. After graduating cum laude with a degree in elementary education, she taught for the USD 259 school district. Soon after, Wagle and her husband started a number of small businesses in the Wichita area. They currently own real estate investments and a real estate management and leasing company.

Susan lives in Wichita with her husband, Tom. Together, they have four children, seven grandchildren and anticipate the birth of their eighth grandchild in August.
