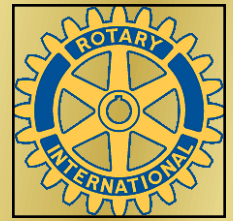

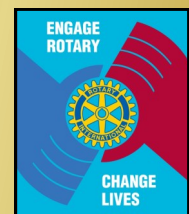

#### **June 23 — Tim Witsman — WIBA President** **“An Appreciation of George Washington”**

Since childhood, Rotarian Tim Witsman has been fascinated with history. He has taken a special interest in the first President of the United States, George Washington (1732 – 1799). In Tim’s view, Washington grasped the forces at play during his lifetime, and exhibited a fuller understanding of the situation than most of the country’s founders.

Tim obtained his BA from Brown University and his MA and PhD from Purdue University. He began his career as a professor in Georgia, but left academe to serve in a number of positions in Savannah, culminating in assistant city manager. His next job was director of budget and management for the city of Chicago. He moved to Wichita to become the first county administrator for Sedgwick County. Tim left there to become the first president of Kansas, Inc. in Topeka. He returned to serve as president of the Wichita Area Chamber of Commerce for more than 15 years. Tim worked in the financial services area for A.G. Edwards before assuming his current position as president of the Wichita Independent Business Association (WIBA) and Wichita Insurance Services in July of 2007. In May of 2013, he also assumed the role of executive director of the Nonprofit Chamber of Service. Tim teaches in the Hugo Wall School of Urban and Public Affairs at Wichita State University.

Tim has been active in many civic and charitable organizations. He served as chairman of the board of the Salvation Army Advisory Board and president of the Rotary Club of Wichita. Tim is a recipient of Rotary’s “Service Above Self” award and the Hugo Wall Award from Wichita State University. He currently serves on the Salvation Army and Wichita Symphony boards, as well as the Cerebral Palsy Research Foundation School of Adaptive Computer Training board.

Getting your organization in the news – if it’s good news, of course – boosts your visibility and can help you increase business, donations, and credibility.
