December 1 — Mike King, Secretary, Kansas Department Of Transportation

Topic: *Current Transportation Projects, Partnerships and Trends*

Mike King was appointed to lead the Kansas Department of Transportation and its 2,900 employees by Governor Sam Brownback on March 23, 2012. A third generation construction industry leader, Mr. King has more than 30 years of private sector experience in transportation and energy construction.

A native of Hesston, Kansas, Mr. King's first construction job had him building bridges and pouring concrete street pavement for his uncle's construction company. After earning a degree in building construction, he worked 10 years for a national construction company building, estimating and managing projects throughout the southern states.

The opportunity to purchase his father's construction business, King Enterprise Group, brought him back to Kansas in 1991. Under his leadership the company grew from a small McPherson-area concrete contractor to a premier central Kansas contractor in the oil/gas and industrial marketplace.

As leader of the Kansas Department of Transportation, Mr. King is committed to fully implementing T-WORKS, with a focus on providing safety enhancements, improving commute times and making the kind of infrastructure improvements that will help spur economic growth and create jobs.

Mr. King is a 1981 graduate of John Brown University with a Bachelor of Science in Building Construction. He and his wife Peggy have four children.

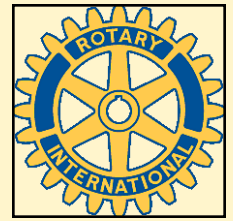


Dr. Mark Bartel is in demand as a versatile conductor and music educator. This season he begins his tenth year as Director of Choral Music at Friends University and Conductor of the Singing Quakers, where he oversees a program of five choirs. Dr. Bartel is also Artistic Director and Conductor of the Wichita Chamber Chorale. From 2006-2011, he was the Artistic Director of the Wichita Community Children's Choir and he is a frequent guest conductor for honor choirs and festivals for singers of all ages. He holds the Master of Music and Master of Sacred Music degrees from Southern Methodist University in Dallas, TX, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N.Y.

Singing has been at the heart of the Friends University experience from the university's inception in 1898, and since 1924 the Friends University Singing Quakers have represented this tradition at home and abroad. Friends University degree programs are designed to nurture students' passion for music, and to prepare for vocations in teaching, performance and ministry. Under the leadership of Dr. Stephen Eaves, the Friends University Division of Fine Arts offers degrees in music, art, theatre and ballet.

Dedicated mentor-teachers, exposure to world-class guest artists and national and international travel are the hallmarks of a comprehensive program, which includes individual applied lessons, participation in choral ensembles and performance in musical theatre and opera productions. Five choirs perform a wide variety of music ranging from standard choral literature to vocal jazz to choral-orchestral masterworks.

The culmination of this 90th anniversary year of the Singing Quakers is the performance and service tour to Costa Rica in May, 2015.

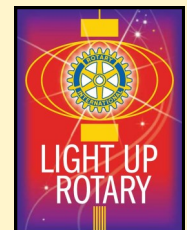
