Topic: *The Whole Story*

Jim Sud will discuss the history, mission and core values of Whole Foods Market, along with the reason that Wichita was chosen for a new store. Sud is the executive vice president of Growth and Business Development of Whole Foods Market. His responsibilities include all areas related to the growth of the company including real estate, mergers and acquisitions and business development.

Sud was a founding shareholder in Whole Foods Market and served on its board of directors from inception to April, 1997, when he joined the company's senior leadership team. He is currently a member of the company's executive and global leadership teams.




February 2 — Steve Radley — President & CEO, NetWork Kansas

Topic: *Small Business Assistance*

Steve Radley is the president and CEO of NetWork Kansas. A resident of Wichita, Radley began his career in the private sector as the 28th employee of a business startup technology company, Brite Voice Systems in Wichita. The company grew from \$6 million to more than \$175 million during the nine years Radley worked for Kansas entrepreneur Stan Brannan. Since then, he has co-owned two businesses including a manufactured housing dealership that was sold to the largest manufacturer in the country, Champion Enterprises. His work experience centers on business development and taking products and businesses from startup to maturity.

Radley has an MBA from the W. Frank Barton School of Business at Wichita State University, an MA in Christian ministry from Friends University, and a BA in journalism from the University of Oklahoma.


