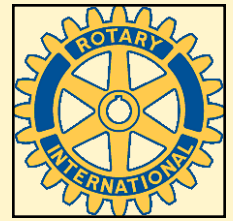

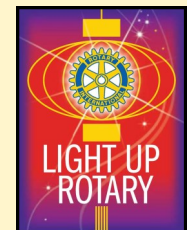

The successful candidate for mayor in the April 7 election, either Jeff Longwell or Sam Williams, will share his vision for Wichita's future with the Rotary Club of Wichita on April 13.



Longwell is a Wichita native and attended Wichita West High School and Wichita State University. He is the president and owner of Ad Astra Print Resources. Since 2007, he has served on the Wichita City Council, representing District V. He served as vice-mayor from April 2010 to April 2011. Longwell is a board member of the Wichita Area Metropolitan Planning Organization and serves on the executive committee for Regional Economic Area Partners. Jeff's non-municipal experience includes 12 years on the Maize Board of Education and 6 years on the Catholic Family Federal Credit Union board of directors. Jeff and wife, Susie, have one daughter, twin sons and one grandchild.

Williams retired as managing partner with the advertising agency of Sullivan Higdon & Sink in July, 2014, where he had served as chief financial officer since 1989. He is an unlicensed certified public accountant and holds a bachelor's degree in accounting from the University of Utah. Sam and his wife, Marilyn, have lived in Wichita since 1989. They have six grown children and nine grandchildren. Williams' past community involvement includes serving as chairman of the Wichita Metro Chamber of Commerce, the United Way of the Plains Campaign and Envision. He is an avid runner and has participated in numerous marathons.

NOTES FROM MARCH 30 MEETING

WICHITA ROTARY CHARITABLE FUND (WRCF) LIFETIME GIVING SOCIETIES ESTABLISHED

This year the Club and WRCF boards have seen fit to establish two new designations for lifetime giving to the WRCF. As you know, the WRCF is the Rotary Club of Wichita's giving arm and is funded primarily by donations from our members. The Fund provides the financial resources to support our club's local projects, such as Reading Is Fundamental, Habitat for Humanity, Junior Achievement and Dictionaries to third-graders. Donations from members are critical if we are to fulfill our mission of raising the level of literacy and financial independence among the less fortunate in our community.

In order to recognize our members who have faithfully contributed to the WRCF, the following designations have been created:

- Fran D. Jabara Society — To recognize members who have donated \$5,000 or more, but less than \$10,000
- Bernard J. Alberts Society — To recognize members who have donated \$2,500 or more, but less than \$5,000

These designations are in addition to the Harry Stanley Society, which was formed to honor members who have contributed \$10,000 or more to the WRCF. Harry Stanley founded our club in 1911.

The Wichita Rotary Charitable Fund dates back to 1983, when President Bernie Alberts recommended that the club form a foundation for the purpose of providing financial support to worthwhile projects in the community, specifically those which furthered education and humanitarian goals. During the 1985 -1986 year as club president, Fran Jabara invited 10 past presidents to join him in contributing \$10,000 each to begin the Fund corpus. Each past president donated \$10,000 and issued a challenge to the other members to collectively match their contributions. The club did meet the challenge and raised another \$110,000. Since that time, club members have continued the tradition of generous giving.

Members who have reached either the Fran D. Jabara Society or Bernard J. Alberts Society levels will be notified soon and inducted in a ceremony later this Rotary year.
