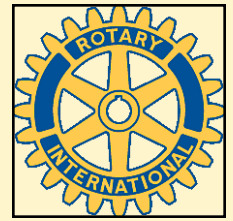

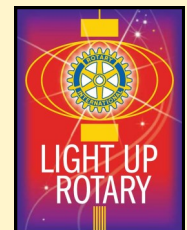

Topic: B-29 Doc Restoration Program

Jeffrey "Jeff" L. Turner retired April 5, 2013 as president and CEO of Spirit AeroSystems, Inc., a position he had held since June 2005 upon the divestiture of the Boeing Commercial Airplanes Wichita Division. In the same year, Turner led a group of business leaders to found a non-profit organization to lead the effort to restore one of the last remaining B-29 aircraft to flying condition. The organization, Doc's Friends, assumed ownership of the vintage airplane and has already coordinated 300,000 volunteer hours of refurbishing work. Doc is expected to take to the air once warmer weather arrives.

A Kansas native, Turner worked for The Boeing Company more than 30 years. He started in 1973 as a part-time programmer while completing his degree at Wichita State University. During his tenure with The Boeing Company, Turner held key management and director positions at Boeing Computer Services, Boeing Military Airplane Company and Boeing Commercial Airplanes located in Wichita and Seattle. From 1995 until the divestiture in June 2005, he served as vice president-general manager for the Wichita division.

Turner received a B.S. in mathematics and computer science in 1973 and a M.S. in engineering management science in 1977, both from Wichita State University. In 1984, he was selected as a Boeing Sloan Fellow to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's (MIT) Sloan School of Management, where he earned a master's degree in management.

Turner is very involved in the local community and serves on the board of directors for INTRUST Bank, World Impact, the Sedgwick County Technical Training Authority and the board of directors for Doc's Friends. Jeff and his wife, Rhonda, are active members of their church and have two adult children and four grandchildren.



March 16 — Eric Haar

Topic: Recent History of Financial Crisis: 2005 — 2015

On March 16, Eric Haar will discuss some of the primary causes of the recent financial crisis and explain how Congress, regulators and the financial services industry reacted. He will share his vision for the future for community banks, credit unions and insurance companies.

Haar heads the Government Relations Department for the Federal Home Loan Bank of Topeka, a \$47 billion Government Sponsored Enterprise (GSE). For the past nine years, he has been responsible for advocating for federal legislation and regulations that are equitable for community financial institutions and their customers.

Haar is in Washington, D.C. twice a month, where he interacts regularly with members of the Kansas congressional delegation. He also works closely with federal regulators to communicate the priorities of the financial services industry.

Prior to his employment at the Federal Home Loan Bank, Haar managed political campaigns both in Kansas and his home state of Indiana. He invests in his adopted hometown of Lawrence, KS by volunteering with three local non-profits. He is a native of Ft. Wayne, IN, and he holds a BA in journalism from Taylor University and an MBA from Indiana University.
