March 16 — Eric Haar
Vice President Government Relations
Federal Home Loan Bank Topeka

Topic: *Recent History of Financial Crisis: 2005 — 2015*

On March 16, Eric Haar will discuss some of the primary causes of the recent financial crisis and explain how Congress, regulators and the financial services industry reacted. He will share his vision for the future for community banks, credit unions and insurance companies, as well as provide an overview of the history and purpose of the Federal Home Loan Bank system.

Haar heads the Government Relations Department for the Federal Home Loan Bank of Topeka, a \$47 billion Government Sponsored Enterprise (GSE). For the past nine years, he has been responsible for advocating for federal legislation and regulations that are equitable for community financial institutions and their customers.

Haar is in Washington, D.C. twice a month, where he interacts regularly with members of the Kansas congressional delegation. He also works closely with federal regulators to communicate the priorities of the financial services industry.

Prior to his employment at the Federal Home Loan Bank, Haar managed political campaigns both in Kansas and his home state of Indiana. He invests in his adopted hometown of Lawrence, Kansas by volunteering with three local non-profits. He is a native of Ft. Wayne, Indiana, and he holds a BA in journalism from Taylor University and an MBA from Indiana University.

Topic: *The QuikTrip Story*

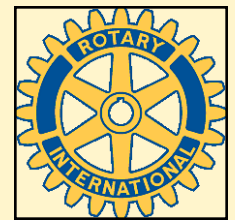

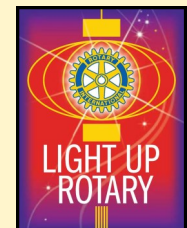

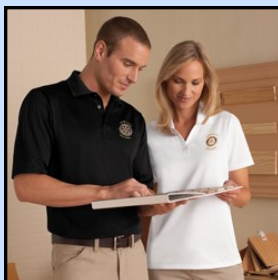
