**March 30 — Charlie Chandler and Jeff Turner**  
**Wichita Metro Chamber of Commerce Leadership Council**  
**Topic: A Vision for the Future of Wichita**

Leadership Council co-chairs Charlie Chandler and Jeff Turner will discuss why the Leadership Council was formed and how the organization's priorities were established. They will also discuss their motivation for being part of an action-oriented force and how the organization is working to shape Wichita's future.



**Charles Q. "Charlie" Chandler, IV** is Chairman and CEO of INTRUST Financial Corporation and INTRUST Bank. He is the fourth generation of Chandlers to lead the bank. He is also a director of Fidelity State Bank & Trust Company in Topeka, a director of First Bank of Newton and chairman of the board of Westar Energy.

Chandler serves as co-chair of the Leadership Council, which was created in 2012 by the Wichita Metro Chamber of Commerce. The Council is a think tank comprised of 100 top business, non-profit and public-sector CEOs for the purpose of discussing and pursuing resolutions of major issues or projects. The mission of the Council is to make the Wichita area competitive for job creation, talent attraction, capital investment and long-term economic prosperity. Chandler's additional community involvement includes KSU Foundation, KSU College of Business Advisory Council, Wesley Medical Center board of trustees, The Navigators, Kansas Chapter of Senior Presidents, the Rotary Club of Wichita, the Society for Children With Challenges and Eastminster Presbyterian Church. Charlie and his wife, Marla, have been married for 38 years and have four children. His hobbies include flying, boating and snow skiing.



**Jeffrey "Jeff" L. Turner** retired on April 5, 2013 as president and CEO of Spirit AeroSystems, Inc., a position he had held since June, 2005 upon the divestiture of the Boeing Commercial Airplanes Wichita Division. As CEO, he successfully led the transition from Boeing Division to an independent company and managed the completion of the company's Initial Public Offering (IPO) in November, 2006.

A Kansas native, Turner worked for The Boeing Company more than 30 years. He started in 1973 as a part-time programmer while completing his degree at Wichita State University. During his tenure with The Boeing Company, Turner held key management and director positions at Boeing Computer Services, Boeing Military Airplane Company and Boeing Commercial Airplanes located in Wichita and Seattle, Washington. From 1995 until the divestiture in June 2005, he served as Vice President-General Manager for the Wichita Division.

Turner is very involved in the local community and serves on the board of directors for INTRUST Bank, World Impact, and Sedgwick County Technical Training Authority, as well as the board of directors for Doc's Friends, a non-profit organization leading the effort to restore one of the last remaining B-29 aircraft to flying condition. Jeff and his wife, Rhonda, are active members of their church and have two adult children and four grandchildren.

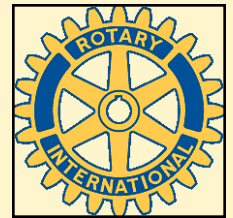
**Topic: Globetrotting with the Biker Banker**

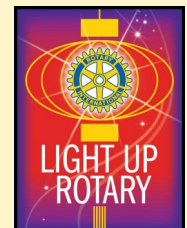
