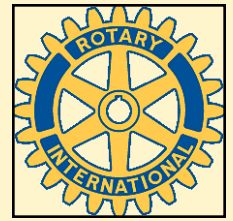

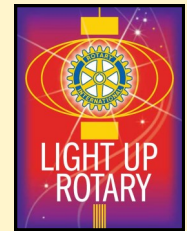

April 13 — City of Wichita Mayor-Elect Jeff Longwell

Topic: *My Vision for Wichita*

Jeff Longwell was the successful candidate for mayor in the April 7 election and next Monday he will share his vision for Wichita's future with the Rotary Club of Wichita.

Longwell is a Wichita native and attended Wichita West High School and Wichita State University. He is the president and owner of Ad Astra Print Resources. Since 2007, Longwell has served on the Wichita City Council, representing District V. He served as vice-mayor from April 2010 to April 2011. He is a board member of the Wichita Area Metropolitan Planning Organization and serves on the executive committee for Regional Economic Area Partners. Jeff's non-municipal experience includes 12 years on the Maize Board of Education and 6 years on the Catholic Family Federal Credit Union board of directors. Jeff and wife, Susie, have one daughter, twin sons and one grandchild. Jeff is a member of the Sunrise Rotary club.



April 20 — Charles "Sam" Gemar Former NASA Astronaut

Topic: *My Life as an Astronaut*

Sam Gemar is a partner with Vintage Flyers, a company operated out of Stearman Field in Benton, Kansas. He is dedicated to providing flight experiences in World War II vintage aircraft. Gemar is a decorated 25-year veteran of the United States Army, serving 12 of those years as an astronaut. As the most junior Army officer ever selected by the U.S. National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), he has flown 3 Space Shuttle missions including STS-38, a classified Department of Defense mission; STS-48, which launched the Upper Atmosphere Research Satellite, and STS-62, involving the U.S. Microgravity Payload II. During the course of the 14-day STS-62 mission, over 60 scientific and medical experiments were conducted.

Gemar has accumulated more than 9,000 flight hours in both rotary and fixed wing aircraft ranging from gliders to multi-engine rockets. He has conducted engineering and certification flight testing on the Learjet 40 and 45, the Bombardier CRJ 200, 700, 900 and 1000, the Global Express 5000 and 6000, as well as, the Battlefield Airborne Communications Node which is currently deployed by the U.S. Air Force in Kandahar, Afghanistan.
