Mirta M. Martin Ph.D.
President — Fort Hays State University

Topic: Education: The Pathway to the American Dream

The Kansas Board of Regents appointed Dr. Mirta M. Martin the ninth president of Fort Hays State University on May 2, 2014, effective July 1. Dr. Martin holds a baccalaureate degree in psychology and political science from Duke University, a master of business administration degree from the University of Richmond and a doctorate with an emphasis in strategic management and leadership from Virginia Commonwealth University. She is fluent in three foreign languages.

Dr. Martin's career involves work in both the public and private sectors, including special expertise in organizational behavior, management, institutional advancement and workforce development. As a senior banking executive, Dr. Martin was recognized as a highly effective and innovative practitioner, positioning companies for growth and profitability via leadership in strategic planning, investment management, operations, business development and legislative advocacy.

Dr. Martin's higher education experience is equally diverse and successful. She has served as tenured professor and interim dean at Averett University, Danville, Va.; associate dean and executive director at the University of Richmond's Robins School of Business; executive vice president and executive director of the John Tyler Community College Foundation; and special assistant to the chancellor of the Virginia Community College System. Most recently, she served as dean and professor of management at the Reginald F. Lewis College of Business at Virginia State University.

Virginia Gov. Bob McDonnell appointed Dr. Martin to the Commission on Higher Education Reform, Innovation and Investment and to the Virginia State Board for Community Colleges. She also served as ex-officio member on behalf of the secretary of education to the Virginia Latino Advisory Board. She was appointed by former Gov. Tim Kaine to serve on the Virginia Council on the Status of Women. She served as co-chair of the Citizenship, Core Values and Innovation Team/Strategic Planning Committee for Chesterfield County Public Schools and on the "Go for Red" Executive Leadership Team of the American Heart Association.

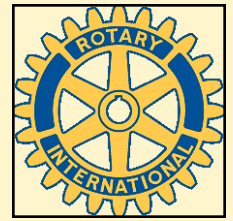
Topic: The Over-criminalization of America — How to Reduce Poverty and Improve Race Relations by Rethinking our Justice System

Mark Holden is senior vice president and general counsel of Koch Industries, Inc. and serves as corporate secretary. He also is president and COO of the Legal Division of Koch Companies Public Sector, LLC, which provides legal, and government and public affairs services to Koch Industries, Inc. and its affiliates.

Mr. Holden also serves on the boards of Koch Industries subsidiaries Georgia-Pacific Equity Holdings, LLC and Molex Electronic Technologies Holdings, LLC.

Before joining Koch in 1995, Mr. Holden was an associate with Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer & Feld in Washington, D.C. Mr. Holden earned a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Massachusetts. He earned his law degree from the Columbus School of Law at the Catholic University of America, where he was an associate editor of the Catholic University Law Review.

Holden has helped lead an initiative to prompt national discussion of criminal justice reform and the implications of what is often referred to as "over-criminalization." In recent months, he has discussed the benefits of reform in a [POLITICO op-ed](#), an appearance on CNN's Anderson Cooper 360, and in interviews with NPR, Yahoo, TIME magazine, the Washington Post, and USA Today, among others.

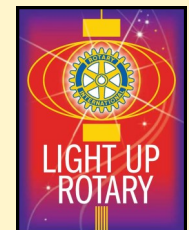

NOTES FROM APRIL 20 MEETING



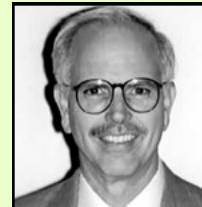

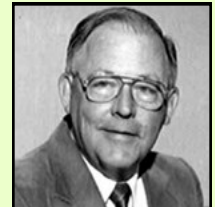
