Koch Industries General Counsel

Topic: *The Over-criminalization of America — How to Reduce Poverty and Improve Race Relations by Rethinking our Justice System*

Mark Holden is senior vice president and general counsel of Koch Industries, Inc. and serves as corporate secretary. He also is president and COO of the Legal Division of Koch Companies Public Sector, LLC, which provides legal, and government and public affairs services to Koch Industries, Inc. and its affiliates.

Mr. Holden also serves on the boards of Koch Industries subsidiaries Georgia-Pacific Equity Holdings, LLC and Molex Electronic Technologies Holdings, LLC.

Before joining Koch in 1995, Mr. Holden was an associate with Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer & Feld in Washington, D.C. Mr. Holden earned a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Massachusetts. He earned his law degree from the Columbus School of Law at the Catholic University of America, where he was an associate editor of the Catholic University Law Review.

Holden has helped lead an initiative to prompt national discussion of criminal justice reform and the implications of what is often referred to as "over-criminalization." In recent months, he has discussed the benefits of reform in a [POLITICO op-ed](#), an appearance on CNN's Anderson Cooper 360, and in interviews with NPR, Yahoo, TIME magazine, the Washington Post, and USA Today, among others.

President & CEO of the Association of Gospel Rescue Missions

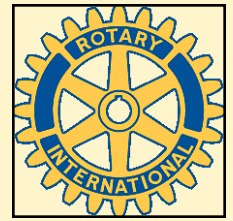
Topic: *Solutions to Homelessness*

John Ashmen is the president and CEO of the Association of Gospel Rescue Missions (AGRM). Founded in 1913, AGRM exists to proclaim the passion of Jesus toward the hungry, homeless, abused and addicted, and to accelerate quality and effectiveness in approximately 300 member missions. AGRM-affiliated organizations annually provide close to 50 million meals and 30 million nights of lodging to the desperate and destitute across North America. These organizations also graduate approximately 25,000 people a year from addiction recovery programs.

For nearly 15 years, Ashmen has served in a COO role at Christian Camp and Conference Association (CCCA), overseeing publications, educational events, technical resources and marketing for the national association. He was the originator, lead writer and executive producer of the multi-award winning Cairn series, a professional training program which focus on Christian camp and conference history and leadership orientation.

Ashmen holds a bachelor of science degree in Bible, with a social work emphasis, from Cairn University, and has a master of organizational management degree from the University of Phoenix. His writings have appeared in numerous books, journals and websites, and he continues to teach countless ministry management seminars internationally. His latest book, *Invisible Neighbors*, published by Cross Section, addresses meaningful engagement with the poor and powerless. He was also instrumental in the establishment of the Global City Mission Network, a nexus of faith-based organizations serving those in abject poverty in the largest cities around the world.

John and his wife, Judi, reside in Colorado Springs, Colorado. They have three children and four grandchildren.

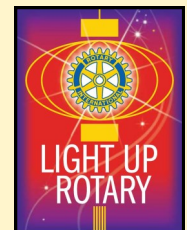
