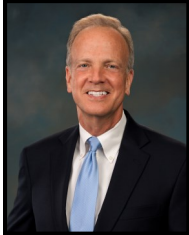

July 6 — U.S. Senator from Kansas Jerry Moran
Topic: *Washington Update*

After he served seven terms in the United States House of Representatives, Kansans elected Jerry Moran to the United States Senate in 2010. In Washington, he is a leading advocate for protecting and preserving the special way of life we live in Kansas.

As a Rotarian himself, Senator Moran shares Rotary's commitment to service and works to stay connected to the people he represents. Despite the distance of more than 1,000 miles between Washington, D. C. and Kansas, he returns home each weekend to meet with Kansans.

Before his election to public office, Jerry Moran attended Fort Hays State University and later the University of Kansas, where he completed a degree in economics. After an early career as a small town banker, he received his J.D. from the University of Kansas School of Law. Jerry and his wife Robba continue to live in Kansas.

Non-Resident Senior Fellow — Brookings Institution
Topic: *Economists are More Important Than You Might Think*

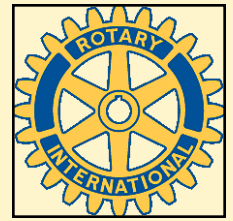
Robert Litan is a non-resident senior fellow at the Brookings Institution, where he formerly directed economic research. He also serves as of counsel to Korein Tillery, a law firm based in St. Louis and Chicago and chief economic adviser to Patent Properties, a public company helping to match inventors with licensees.

Litan recently returned to Wichita, where he grew up and graduated from Southeast high school, after spending nearly four decades in high level positions in think tanks, the government arena and the private sector. In addition to directing research at Brookings, Litan has directed research at the Kauffman Foundation and at Bloomberg Government. He also served as deputy assistant attorney general for Antitrust at the Justice Department and as associate director of the Office of Management and Budget.

Litan is author or co-author of 25 books and more than 200 articles on a wide range of public policy issues. He will speak to our club about how economists are more important than you think, based on his latest book, *Trillion Dollar Economists* (Bloomberg Press, 2014).
