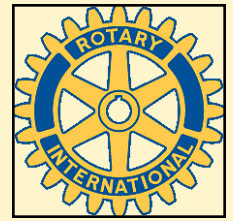

July 13 — Robert E. Litan
Non-Resident Senior Fellow — Brookings Institution
Topic: Economists are More Important Than You Might Think

Robert Litan is a non-resident senior fellow at the Brookings Institution, where he formerly directed economic research. He also serves as of counsel to Korein Tillery, a law firm based in St. Louis and Chicago and chief economic adviser to Patent Properties, a public company helping to match inventors with licensees.

Litan recently returned to Wichita, where he grew up and graduated from Southeast high school, after spending nearly four decades in high level positions in think tanks, the government arena and the private sector. In addition to directing research at Brookings, Litan has directed research at the Kauffman Foundation and at Bloomberg Government. He also served as deputy assistant attorney general for Antitrust at the Justice Department and as associate director of the Office of Management and Budget.

Litan is author or co-author of 25 books and more than 200 articles on a wide range of public policy issues. He will speak to our club about how economists are more important than you think, based on his latest book, *Trillion Dollar Economists* (Bloomberg Press, 2014).



July 20 — Martin Ratcliffe
Internationally Recognized Planetarium Expert and Astronomy Educator

Topic: A Short History of the Universe

Martin Ratcliffe is a contributing editor for the national magazine *Astronomy*, and has written the publication's *Night Sky* column since 1996. He currently serves as the director of professional development at the planetarium company Sky-Skan. Ratcliffe served as president of the International

Planetarium Society from 2001 to 2002. He has authored four books and has written numerous planetarium shows. He is also a series editor for *Springer Briefs in Astrophysics*.

Ratcliffe moved to the United States from England in 1991 to direct the Buhl Planetarium at the Carnegie Science Center in Pittsburg, PA. He later managed the CyberDome theater, now Boeing Dome Theater & Planetarium at Exploration Place in Wichita. He has served as a council member of the British Astronomical Association and Society for Popular Astronomy in the United Kingdom.

Ratcliffe earned his bachelor's of science degree from University College London in astronomy. He is an adjunct lecturer at Wichita State University and a Fellow of the Royal Astronomical Society.
