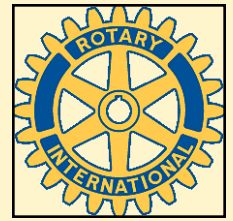

August 24 — Anthony Mattivi
Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Kansas
Topic: *Fighting Terrorism and Crime in an Increasingly Hostile and Dangerous World*

On Monday, Anthony Mattivi will discuss his experiences from 2008 to 2013 as lead counsel in the prosecution by military commission of Abd al-Rahim Al Nashiri at Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Nashiri is the high-level al Qaeda operative sent to Yemen by Usama bin Laden to commit what ultimately became the attack on USS COLE and claimed the lives of 17 American sailors in 2007.

Mattivi has been an Assistant United States Attorney for the District of Kansas for more than fifteen years, prosecuting federal violations including drug trafficking, violent crime, racketeering, gangs, organized crime, money laundering and terrorism. He also has briefed and argued cases in the Tenth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals. He sits on Department of Justice's Capital Case Review Committee, which reviews capital-eligible federal cases and makes a recommendation to the Attorney General whether or not to seek the death penalty.

For nearly five years, Mattivi was detailed to DOJ's National Security Division, which assigned him to the Office of the Chief Prosecutor for Military Commissions. In addition to serving as the lead prosecutor on the case against the high-level al Qaeda operative who masterminded the bombing of the USS COLE, Mattivi spent six months working for DOJ's Regime Crimes Liaison Office in Baghdad, Iraq, advising and assisting the Iraqi High Tribunal with the trials of members of Saddam Hussein's regime for war crimes and crimes against humanity.

Mattivi prosecuted Terry Lee Loewen, the former U.S. Marine who recently pled guilty to attempting to detonate a van filled with what he thought were high explosives at the Wichita airport on behalf of al Qaeda during the Christmas travel season. He is presently prosecuting John T. Booker, who is charged with trying to detonate a truck bomb at Fort Riley on behalf of ISIS.

Mattivi graduated with honors from the Washburn University School of Law in 1994.



August 31 — Dr. Paul Harrison
Medical Director of Wesley Medical Center Level I Trauma Service (1986-2015); Current Assistant Medical Director
Topic: *Trauma — A Look Back to the Future*

Dr. Paul Harrison will speak about the evolution of trauma treatment in medicine during the past 30 years, including the advancements and changes he has encountered.

Dr. Harrison is from Wichita. He received his medical degree from the University of Kansas School of Medicine in Kansas City and completed a surgical residency at Wesley Medical Center.

Dr. Harrison is board certified by the American Board of Surgery with a certificate in general surgery and critical care. He is past president of the medical staff at Wesley Medical Center and served as medical director of level I trauma service from 1986 to 2015. He currently serves as the assistant medical director of Wesley's trauma service.
