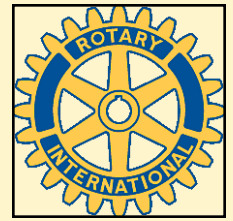

Medical Director of Wesley Medical Center Level I Trauma Service (1986-2015); Current Assistant Medical Director  
**Topic: Trauma — A Look Back to the Future**

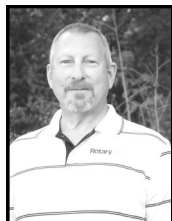
On Monday, Dr. Paul Harrison will speak about the evolution of trauma treatment in medicine during the past 30 years, including the advancements and changes this field has experienced.

Dr. Harrison is from Wichita. He received his medical degree from the University of Kansas School of Medicine in Kansas City and completed a surgical residency at Wesley Medical Center. Dr. Harrison is board certified by the American Board of Surgery with a certificate in general surgery and critical care. He is past president of the medical staff at Wesley Medical Center and served as medical director of level I trauma service from 1986 to 2015. He currently serves as the assistant medical director of Wesley's trauma service.

Dr. Harrison has chaired the governor-appointed advisory committee on trauma for the State of Kansas since 2000. Since 2010, he has chaired the Kansas Chapter of the American College of Surgeons committee on trauma. He is a long-time contributing member of the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma, the Western Trauma Association and the Society of Critical Care Medicine.
