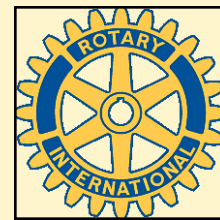

September 14 — District Governor David Yoder Topic: *A New Vision for Our District*

You will be entertained, informed and impressed with his passion for Rotary when he addresses our club.

David Yoder is a past president of the Newton Rotary Club and has served as assistant governor for five years. A Rotarian for 14 years, he has been an active club board member and involved in planning and instructing at Heartland President Elect Training (PETS.)

In his non-Rotary life, David has held the elected position of Harvey County Attorney since 2002. He is a graduate of Wichita State University and the Washburn University School of Law. He served five years in the United States Air Force as a judge advocate. He and his wife, Lori, reside in Newton and have six children.



September 21 — Roy Wenzl — Wichita Eagle Reporter, Photographer, Editor and Author Topic: *Common People, Uncommon Courage*

Roy Wenzl has been with the Wichita Eagle for 19 years. In addition to writing hundreds of memorable stories for the newspaper, Wenzl was the primary author of the 2007 book "Bind, Torture, Kill; The Inside Story of the Serial Killer Next Door." He was also the primary author of the 2013 book "The Miracle of Father Kapau". Two of his serial narratives, "Saving Dad" and "Hope City," were published in Reader's Digest. In 1981, Wenzl was part of the news team at the Kansas City Star and Times that won a 1982 Pulitzer prize for coverage of the Hyatt Hotel skywalk collapse.

Wenzl has won many national newspaper journalism awards during his career. He has taught writing in newsrooms, university classrooms, National Writers Workshops and the American Press Institute.

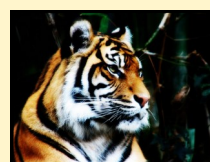

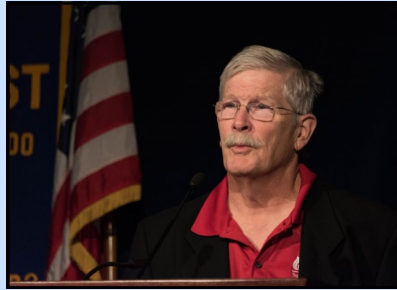
