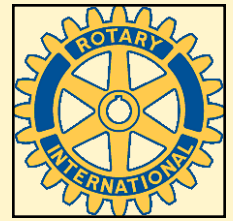

September 21 — Roy Wenzl — Wichita Eagle Reporter, Photographer, Editor and Author
Topic: *Common People, Uncommon Courage*

Roy Wenzl has been with the Wichita Eagle for 19 years. In addition to writing hundreds of memorable stories for the newspaper, Wenzl was the primary author of the 2007 book "Bind, Torture, Kill; The Inside Story of the Serial Killer Next Door." He was also the primary author of the 2013 book "The Miracle of Father Kapau". Two of his serial narratives, "Saving Dad" and "Hope City," were published in Reader's Digest. In 1981, Wenzl was part of the news team at the Kansas City Star and Times that won a 1982 Pulitzer prize for coverage of the Hyatt Hotel skywalk collapse.

Wenzl has won many national newspaper journalism awards during his career. He has taught writing in newsrooms, university classrooms, National Writers Workshops and the American Press Institute.

Roy attended Kansas State University where he earned a degree in journalism. He and his wife, Sheryl, have three grown children and three grandchildren, all here in Wichita. Roy is a native Kansan, growing up on a farm in Washington County. His family still operates the farm.

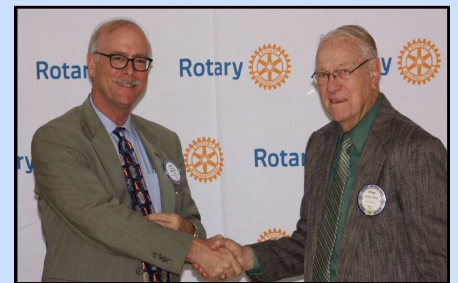
