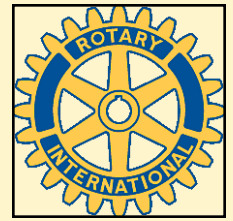

October 19 — Coach Gregg Marshall Wichita State University Men's Head Basketball Coach

Gregg Marshall has built Wichita State into a monster of the Midwest and, in the process, ascended as one of college basketball's elite head coaches.

Now entering his ninth season at WSU and his 18th overall, Marshall is the only coach in Division I who has posted 30 or more wins in each of the past three seasons, and his .839 winning percentage (151-29) over the last five years is a national-best. Under Marshall's guidance, WSU has been on a steady rise, topping 25 wins in each of the past six seasons.

Marshall's Shockers followed up a 2011 NIT championship with four-straight NCAA tournament trips, including runs to the 2013 Final Four and the 2015 Sweet 16. The 2014 squad ran the table in the regular season, becoming the first team in 23 years to enter the Big Dance with an unbeaten record (35-0.)

In his 18 seasons as a head coach, Marshall's teams have captured nine regular season conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Tournament 11 times, while compiling a 398-159 overall record. He's won seven conference coach-of-the-year honors, including three years in a row from 2012-14.

Gregg is married to Lynn and they are the parents of a son, Kellen, and a daughter, Maggie.



October 26 — Sedgwick County Sheriff Jeff Easter

Topic: *Issues Facing Law Enforcement in Sedgwick County*

On October 26, Sheriff Jeff Easter will address some timely but controversial topics such as protocol for officer-related shootings, violent crime among races and violence against law enforcement.

Sheriff Jeff Easter is a native of Kansas and received his bachelor's degree in management from Friends University. In 2012, Easter was elected sheriff of Sedgwick County and he took office on December 17, 2012. In his position, he supervises more than 500 employees in operations, investigations, court services, and detention.

Easter has received training on street gangs throughout the United States and he currently teaches on the subject at various sites. He began his law enforcement career with the Wichita Police Department (WPD) in 1989. During his tenure with the WPD, he worked in a variety of capacities which prepared him for the role of county sheriff. He retired from the WPD in 2012.

Jeff is married to Kimberlee and they have three daughters and a son.
