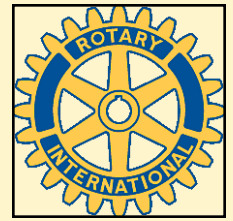

Business Owner and Former President — Cornejo & Sons

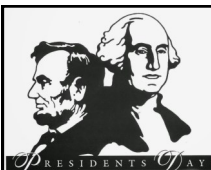
Topic: *The Cornejo Story*

Marty Cornejo remembers sweeping floors, raiding trucks for pop bottles, chipping mortar off bricks and pulling nails at the family business, Cornejo & Sons, from a young age. Hard and often dirty work fit well with the business philosophy of their father, Jess, who was business-smart well beyond his fourth-grade education. "Boys, go find something to do that nobody else wants to do. Haul trash or scrap or dig a ditch. That's where I think you'll do your best," he would say. Marty will tell you that a key to his success is the upbringing and work ethic that his father and his mother, Josephine, demonstrated while raising five boys and growing a business.

Those lessons and values served Marty and his brothers well. The family construction and materials company had grown to 600 employees and \$100 million in annual sales in 2010 when it was acquired by Summit Materials. Cornejo & Sons was one of the country's top 100 Hispanic-owned businesses, with Marty serving as president and Marty's oldest brother Ron in the CEO position.

Marty joined the business right out of school and soon was in charge of Cornejo & Sons Waste Systems, which was formed in the early 80's and acquired by BFI in 1988. He steadily became involved in other facets of the business, such as paving and materials. Currently, he and Ron are working together under C&S Group, Inc., which owns real estate and other ventures.

Marty is married to Jenae and they have 3 sons. He serves on the board of the Shocker Athletic Scholarship Organization (SASO) and as a director on the Wichita Area Chamber of Commerce board. A 1999 Wichita Business Journal 40 Under 40 honoree, he has long history of service to community organizations, including Big Brothers Big Sisters.

In 2008, Ryan Baty founded THE mattress HUB and has since developed it into a leading mattress retailer throughout Kansas, Oklahoma and Missouri. As CEO, he is responsible for all aspects of the business including operations, merchandising, staffing, inventory management and corporate strategy.

Baty's hands-on approach to business has helped to build a strong corporate culture that focuses on developing all personnel both personally and professionally. Baty earned a master's in business administration (MBA) from Newman University in 2014 and has been recognized in the bedding industry as an innovative and aggressive leader.

Baty is a Wichita native who attended the University of Kansas on a baseball scholarship, where he studied strategic planning and history. From 2000-2004, he was a three-time team captain, as well as a multi-year All Conference (Big XII) and All American selection. In 2004, Ryan received the Jayhawk Scholar Athlete of the Year award and shortly thereafter signed a professional contract with the Tampa Bay Rays organization.

Ryan is married to Alicia and they have two children, Reese and Landry.
