April 11 — Dr. Stephen Benson Clinical Psychologist Topic: Alzheimer's Disease: Current Trends and How It Impacts Your Bottom Line

Much has been written about the aging disease of Alzheimer's, with a focus on patients and their families. But Alzheimer's also has a significant impact

on the business community. Dr. Stephen Benson will discuss the financial effect of Alzheimer's, not only to the patients and their families, but to the businesses which employ the caregivers or have lost employees who have been forced to leave the workforce to care for a loved one.

Dr. Benson is a licensed clinical psychologist specializing in adult and older adult psychotherapy, testing, and consultation. Originally from the Seattle area, he did his training at Rosemead School of Psychology in Los Angeles and then completed a post-doctoral fellowship in San Antonio. He has been practicing in Wichita, Kansas since 2000. Dr. Benson provides a variety of services for individuals ages 18 and older. He also specializes with older adults and is recognized as an expert in geriatrics, frequently consulting with medical and legal professionals, social services agencies, nursing facilities, and families.

Adventure Travel & Walking Guide, Author, Speaker and
Owner of Right Path Adventures
Topic: Finding the Right Path in the Dolomites of Northern Italy

Gary Scott is a much-in-demand adventure travel and walking guide who spends half the year guiding in northern Italy. Previously a world-class mountaineer and mountain guide, Gary has organized and guided over 250 international adventure travel trips including 40 treks and expeditions to Nepal and over 80 walking tours in the Italian Alps.

A pioneer of extreme rock climbing in Australia, Gary has over 200 first ascents to his credit. In 1986, he set a world record for the first ever one-day ascent of Denali in Alaska. He climbed it alone and unsupported from the 7,000 ft. base to the 20,300 ft. summit in an amazing 18 hours - on a mountain that often takes 18 <u>days</u> to climb. The record stood for 27 years. He has climbed many famous mountains around the world and was the co-leader on two successful Mount Everest expeditions, reaching 27,500 ft. himself without using supplemental oxygen.

Gary left his native Australia at the age of 24 with a daypack, a passport and a one-way ticket to Kathmandu, Nepal, and he still considers himself to be on that same trip. For the last ten years he has been on the road pretty much full time visiting friends and exploring different parts of the world while promoting and leading his walking tours. He currently operates his travel company *Right Path Adventures* from his laptop. A published author and frequent speaker, Gary will be speaking about why the Dolomites of northern Italy recently became a UNESCO World Heritage Nature site and why it is his favorite place in the world.
