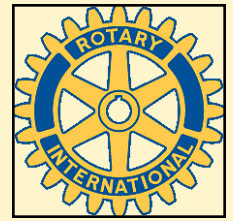

April 18 — Gary Scott
Adventure Travel & Walking Guide, Author, Speaker and
Owner of Right Path Adventures
Topic: Finding the Right Path in the Dolomites of Northern Italy

Gary Scott is a much-in-demand adventure travel and walking guide who spends half the year guiding in northern Italy. Previously a world-class mountaineer and mountain guide, Gary has organized and guided over 250 international adventure travel trips including 40 treks and expeditions to Nepal and over 80 walking tours in the Italian Alps.

A pioneer of extreme rock climbing in Australia, Gary has over 200 first ascents to his credit. In 1986, he set a world record for the first ever one-day ascent of Denali in Alaska. He climbed it alone and unsupported from the 7,000 ft. base to the 20,300 ft. summit in an amazing 18 hours - on a mountain that often takes 18 days to climb. The record stood for 27 years. He has climbed many famous mountains around the world and was the co-leader on two successful Mount Everest expeditions, reaching 27,500 ft. himself without using supplemental oxygen.

Gary left his native Australia at the age of 24 with a daypack, a passport and a one-way ticket to Kathmandu, Nepal, and he still considers himself to be on that same trip. For the last ten years he has been on the road pretty much full time visiting friends and exploring different parts of the world while promoting and leading his walking tours. He currently operates his travel company *Right Path Adventures* from his laptop. A published author and frequent speaker, Gary will be speaking about why the Dolomites of northern Italy recently became a UNESCO World Heritage Nature site and why it is his favorite place in the world.



April 25 — Mike Scholes — Sedgwick County Manager
Topic: A Vision for Sedgwick County

Mike Scholes, county manager, comes to Sedgwick County with 33 years of experience in the US Army, most recently serving as chief of staff for the Kosovo Forces, NATO. He is a retired brigadier general, with numerous military awards and commendations. In his military experience, Scholes helped cities and communities overseas with rebuilding of public infrastructure and providing municipal support services, with a staff from 31 nations. He also helped lead

Hurricane Katrina emergency relief operations and coordinated response efforts to assist with the Haiti Earthquake response. Scholes served as commander of the FEMA Region IV Homeland Response Force, with significant crisis planning and response expertise. He also has firefighter, EMT and police experience.

Scholes holds a master's in public administration from Georgia College and State University, a bachelor's in business administration from North Georgia College and a master's in national security policy from the United States Army War College. He is married with five children.

Wichita-Andover Tornado Commemoration

Rotarians Dan Dillon and Mike Smith will participate in the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of the Wichita-Andover Tornado. The event will be on April 26, 5:45 pm, at St. Vincent's Catholic Church on the west side of Andover Road between U.S. 54/400 and Central Avenue. Mike and Dan led the warning effort that evening which saved more than 70 lives. The presentations will end at 7 pm. There will be breakout tables with safety information and memorabilia from the tornado that will be accessible from 5 pm until 8 pm.
