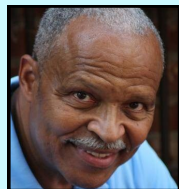

Washington Bureau Chief — USA Today
Topic: *Is This Any Way to Choose a Commander in Chief?
Observations from the Campaign Trail***

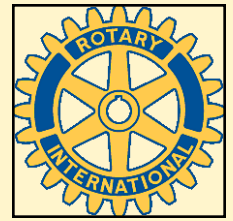
Susan Page, a native of Wichita and graduate of Southeast High School, is an award-winning journalist and the Washington Bureau chief of USA Today. She has covered the last five White House administrations and in 2016 is covering her tenth presidential election. She has interviewed the past eight presidents, from Richard Nixon through Barack Obama (three after they left office). She's reported from five continents and dozens of foreign countries.

Page regularly guest-hosts *The Diane Rehm Show* on NPR and appears on PBS' NewsHour, CBS' *Face the Nation*, NBC's *Meet the Press*, *Fox News Sunday*, and other TV and radio programs. She has served as president of the White House Correspondents Association, chair of the Robert F. Kennedy Journalism Awards, a juror for the Pulitzer Prizes and president of the Gridiron Club, the oldest association of journalists in Washington.

Page has twice been awarded the Gerald R. Ford Prize for Distinguished Reporting on the Presidency. The White House Correspondents Association has honored her with the Merriman Smith Memorial Award for Deadline Reporting on the Presidency as well as the Aldo Beckman Memorial Award, given for excellence in coverage of the White House.

Susan is the daughter of the late Robert Page, former president of the Garvey Co., and the late Marjorie Page, founder of the Wichita Junior Golf Foundation. She received a bachelor's degree from Northwestern University, where she was editor-in-chief of *The Daily Northwestern*. She received a master's degree from Columbia University, where she was a Pulitzer Fellow. She is married to Carl Leubsdorf, a columnist with *The Dallas Morning News*. They have two sons, Ben and Will.
