June 13 — Wayne Bryan and the Music Theatre Wichita Performers

Topic: *Thank You For the Music*

That catchy ABBA tune, *Thank You for the Music*, provides the theme for Music Theatre Wichita's 45th anniversary season which kicks off on Wednesday night, June 15th. Producing Artistic Director Wayne Bryan now begins his 29th summer with the company. He will be bringing several of this season's young performers, who were all carefully selected from the 1,092 aspiring actor-singer-dancers who auditioned in five different cities last spring.

This season pays special tribute to songwriters who changed the sound of America's musical theatre. Each of the five productions this summer also features at least one former collegiate company member who is now a Broadway veteran.

George Gershwin is arguably the greatest composer that America has produced. His musical "Nice Work if You Can Get It" offers over two dozen of his incredible songs, plus some witty interpolations of his symphonic work here and there. Disney's "Beauty and the Beast" boasts an Academy Award winning score, and will be the all-family show this summer (and remember all attendees must be at least 5 years of age.)

Rodgers and Hammerstein's "Oklahoma!" will burst with fresh new life thanks to a great cast and all those timeless songs. Andrew Lloyd Webber's "Jesus Christ Superstar" serves as a homecoming for Joe Locarro, who played Jesus for us in 1990 and has since become one of our favorite directors ("Les Miserables" and "Ragtime").

The season finale "Mamma Mia!" should be a joyful event on many levels. Our former company member and frequent leading lady Kim Huber (Broadway's "Beauty and the Beast") returns as Donna.

Author of *True Reagan: What Made Ronald Reagan Great and Why It Matters*

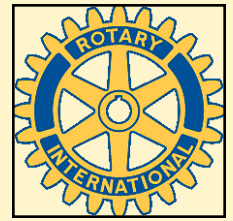

In 1981, James Rosebush joined the Reagan administration where he served as director of the Office of Business Liaison in the U.S. Department of Commerce. Later that year, he was appointed deputy chief of staff to the president. His responsibilities included the development of a domestic policy program which became known as *Private Sector Initiatives*. He also served as a member of the president's historic *Theme for the Day* communications team. Rosebush simultaneously served as First Lady Nancy Reagan's Chief of Staff. As he interacted with the president and his family as a trusted advisor, he enjoyed an unusual position whereby he could observe and understand the unique character of Ronald Reagan.

For over twenty years, Rosebush has been the CEO of an international consulting firm, GrowthStrategy, Inc., advising on management strategies, finance, marketing and communications throughout the world. He also has significant experience in philanthropy.

Rosebush has a B.A. in business administration from the Principia College in Elsau, Illinois, and an M.A. in public affairs from Boston University. He has taught at Georgetown University and George Washington University on the subject of corporate/public issues management and the history of philanthropy.

A native of Flint, Michigan, James resides in the Washington, D.C. area with his wife Nancy. They have two grown daughters and four grandchildren.
