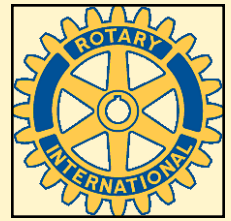

July 18 — District 5690 Governor Dean Kennedy

Topic: *Why Are You A Rotarian?*

Dean Kennedy has been a Rotarian since 1990 and is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow and sustaining member of the Rotary Foundation. He is a past president of the Rotary Club of Winfield and is excited about his term as the 2016-2017 district governor. Kennedy founded RYLA for District 5690 and is known as "Mr. RYLA". He and his wife, Cheryl, have hosted many group study exchange team members and participated in various other Rotary, Russian and youth exchanges.

Kennedy is a graduate of Pittsburg State University and Southwestern Graduate Trust School at Southern Methodist University. His vocation spans over 46 years in trust and estate work in banking. He is currently the executive vice-president and trust officer at Community National Bank & Trust in Winfield. Kennedy is active in many organizations including the Chamber of Commerce, Leadership Cowley County, First United Methodist Church, 4-H and the American Red Cross. He has served two terms as assistant district governor and has received the Rotary Service Above Self award at both the club and district level.

Dean and Cheryl have been married for over 43 years and have two daughters. He plans for his 6 grandchildren to attend RYLA when they are old enough.



July 25 — Wichita Police Chief Gordon Ramsay

Topic: *Challenges and Opportunities for Wichita Law Enforcement*

Chief Gordon Ramsay joined the Wichita Police Department in January of this year. Before coming to Wichita, he had served as police chief in Duluth, MN since 2006, where he was appointed to the position of chief at the age of 34, making him the youngest chief in the history of the city.

Ramsay holds a bachelor's degree in criminology and sociology from the University of Minnesota — Duluth and a master's degree in management from the College of St. Scholastica. He graduated from the FBI National Academy in 2005. Ramsay is past president of the Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association and past general chair of the International Association of Chiefs of Police Mid-Size Agency Section.

Throughout his career, he has received numerous awards for his community policing efforts and service to those he serves. Chief Ramsay resides in Wichita with his wife and two children.
