July 25 — Wichita Police Chief Gordon Ramsay

Topic: *Challenges and Opportunities for Wichita Law Enforcement*

Chief Gordon Ramsay joined the Wichita Police Department in January of this year. Before coming to Wichita, he had served as police chief in Duluth, MN since 2006, where he was appointed to the position of chief at the age of 34, making him the youngest chief in the history of the city.

Ramsay holds a bachelor's degree in criminology and sociology from the University of Minnesota — Duluth and a master's degree in management from the College of St. Scholastica. He graduated from the FBI National Academy in 2005. Ramsay is past president of the Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association and past general chair of the International Association of Chiefs of Police Mid-Size Agency Section.

Throughout his career, he has received numerous awards for his community policing efforts and service to those he serves. Chief Ramsay resides in Wichita with his wife and two children.



August 1 — Mayor Jeff Longwell

Topic: *The State of the City*

Mayor Jeff Longwell grew up in west Wichita and attended West High School and Wichita State University. Longwell's private sector career has included positions as president of Ad Astra Print Resources, marketing director for The Print Source and general manager for Thermal Trade Graphics.

Longwell started his community involvement as a school board member in the Maize school district where his children attended school. He was active on the school board for 12 years, during which he served as president, vice-president, and head of governmental relations.

His experience on the school board led to his interest in running for Wichita City Council. In April, 2007, Longwell was elected to the City Council representing District 5. While serving on the council, he was influential in developing flood control measures, increasing public safety and improving access to an emerging west Wichita.

On April 7, 2015, Longwell was elected mayor to the largest city in Kansas and is currently serving his first term in office as mayor of Wichita. Jeff has been active in numerous political and community organizations including the Northwest YMCA board of directors, the Catholic Family Federal Credit Union board of directors and the Sunrise Rotary Club. Jeff and his wife, Susie, have one daughter, twin sons and a granddaughter.
