

August 1 — Mayor Jeff Longwell

Topic: *The State of the City*

Mayor Jeff Longwell grew up in west Wichita and attended West High School and Wichita State University. Longwell's private sector career has included positions as president of Ad Astra Print Resources, marketing director for The Print Source and general manager for Thermal Trade Graphics.

Longwell started his community involvement as a school board member in the Maize school district where his children attended school. He was active on the school board for 12 years, during which he served as president, vice-president, and head of governmental relations.

His experience on the school board led to his interest in running for Wichita City Council. In April, 2007, Longwell was elected to the City Council representing District 5. While serving on the council, he was influential in developing flood control measures, increasing public safety and improving access to an emerging west Wichita.

On April 7, 2015, Longwell was elected mayor to the largest city in Kansas and is currently serving his first term in office as mayor of Wichita. Jeff has been active in numerous political and community organizations including the Northwest YMCA board of directors, the Catholic Family Federal Credit Union board of directors and the Sunrise Rotary Club. Jeff and his wife, Susie, have one daughter, twin sons and a granddaughter .



August 8 — Rebecca Martin Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) — Special Agent

Topic: *The FBI Today and Its Investigative Priorities*

A native of Ohio, Rebecca Martin earned both a bachelor's and a master's degree in criminal justice from the University of Cincinnati. She worked as a Cincinnati police officer assigned to the patrol division for 5 years before joining the FBI as a special agent in 1997. Her years with the FBI have taken her to Kansas City and Wichita, where she has been assigned to the investigation of predominately white collar crime.

Martin currently serves as a supervisory senior resident agent in Wichita. In this position, she supervises the Wichita and Garden City offices in criminal and national security matters. For over 12 years, Martin served on the Kansas City FBI response team and participated on interview boards for new agents.

In her spare time, Rebecca is an avid health enthusiast who runs and works out at the YMCA on a regular basis. She loves to garden and volunteers at her church and her children's school. In addition, she volunteers her with Neighbor Ministries Step Stone program and has served as a team captain for the past 6 years for the Wichita ALS annual walk. Rebecca's mother tragically passed way from ALS in 2013. Her husband, Kevin Kochenderfer, is a sergeant with the Wichita Police department and they have three children.
