**September 19 — Sedgwick County Commissioner Forum with Candidates Marcey Gregory and David Dennis**

**Marcey Gregory** resides in Goddard, Kansas, where she has served as mayor since 2007. She has been the co-owner of the property management firm of MG Ventures since 1995 and is the previous owner of the retail sports merchant First Gear. Gregory is the current secretary/treasurer of the Sedgwick County Association of Cities and serves on the executive board of the Kansas Mayor's Association. She also serves as the water resource chair for the Regional Area Economic Partnership and is the past president and a current member of the Goddard Woman's Club. Gregory is a current member of the Lion's Club and served on the Goddard Planning Commission from 2005 to 2007. She attended Wichita North High School and Wichita State University. She and her husband, Gary, have two grown sons.



**David Dennis** attended Fort Hays State College and graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration and education in 1968. He enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and later earned a master's degree in public administration from the University of Oklahoma.

After serving in the Air Force for 29 years, Dennis and his wife Janet, both Great Bend natives, retired to western Sedgwick County, where Dennis completed requirements for his teaching certificate at Wichita State University. He taught computer and business classes at Wichita High School North for eleven years.

Dennis has served on the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission for nine years, often in leadership roles. He also served eight years on the Wichita City Council District V Advisory Board. On a statewide level, Dennis was elected District 10 representative to the Kansas State Board of Education and served as chairman for two of his four years. He also served on the executive board at the Kansas State High School Activities Association. Nationally, he served on the National Association of State Boards of Education.



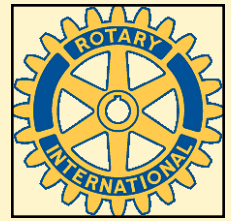
**September 26 — Terri Moses  
Executive Director of Safety Services for  
Wichita Public Schools**

**Topic: *Protecting Our Future***

Terri Moses is a Kansas native, raised in a rural community in Northeast Kansas. She moved to Wichita to attend Wichita State University. Upon graduation from WSU, she joined the Wichita Police Department and worked her way through the ranks of the department. In 1995, she became the first female to attain the rank of deputy chief. In 2013, Moses retired from the Wichita Police Department after 32 years of service. Immediately following retirement, she continued her public safety career by becoming the executive director of the Safety Services Department for Wichita public schools.

While working in the Wichita Police Department, Moses returned to Wichita State and received her master's degree in 1990. She is also a graduate of the FBI National Academy and has received numerous awards throughout her public safety career, including the Kansas Chiefs of Police Silver award. Moses was named a Woman of Distinction by the Wichita Area Girl Scouts in 1997 and as one of the Top Twenty Women in Business by the Wichita Business Journal in 2003. Moses received a Parentage Award from the Wichita Section of The National Council of Negro Women, Inc. in 2004 and was named Outstanding Criminal Justice Alumni by Wichita State University in 2008. In 2014, she received the Recognition Award from the Wichita State University Alumni Association.

Terri is married to Wichita attorney David Moses and they have two grown sons.

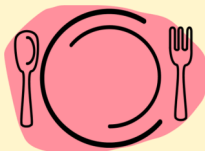
