

Topic: #LOVEICT: A Walk Through The Douglas Design District

Janelle King exhibits a passionate love of the city and all things art.

Originally from the Kansas City area, King holds a bachelor's degree in business administration with a major in marketing from Kansas State University. She cut her teeth in the interior design business with Abode Home before the store closed in 2010, after which she began her independent design business JK Design and never looked back. In 2013, she opened The Workroom which is a sewing workroom for home textiles including: custom drapery, bedding, pillows, headboards & more with a retail front of local art, artisan accessories and Wichita Flag Swag merchandise. The Workroom is home to the Second Saturday Artisan Market which is in its third year and runs from April through October featuring dozens of local artists, live music and food trucks.

As a board member of the Douglas Design District since 2014, King has been driving a cultural shift in the area, striving to change the perception of Wichita among both residents and outsiders. In 2015, she launched Avenue Art Days, which is a local initiative to install art throughout the district, and engaged both volunteers and artists to proudly showcase their artistic talents.

Janelle is the busy mother of two daughters, ages 8 and 13.

Topic: Brewed for the Locals

Torrey Lattin started home brewing 7 years ago as a hobby. After he and Stacy took a trip to Colorado, they realized that Wichita had the potential to grow in the craft beer industry. So the business planning began to open a small taproom with the intent to distribute in the Wichita area. After going through several different names, Torrey noticed a small garden gnome and thought of the name, "hopping" for the hops in the beer, and gnomes who are known for drinking.

Hopping Gnome Brewing officially opened May 29, 2015. Torrey was able to leave his job to brew and run the business full time by that fall. Stacy works full time at Zernco, Inc, while supporting the brewery's business development, marketing, and events. The brewery also employs several staff to help run the taproom and attend events.

Torrey, who is from Lyons, and Stacy, a Wichita native, met while attending Fort Hays State University. They share a passion for the Buy Local movement and often partner with other businesses and food trucks in the community. In addition, they participate in local charitable events.
