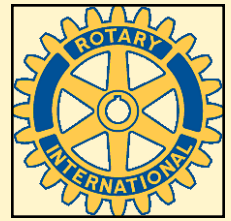

October 17 — Hopping Gnome Brewing Company Owners Torrey Lattin and Stacey Ward-Lattin

Topic: *Brewed for the Locals*

Torrey Lattin started home brewing 7 years ago as a hobby. After he and Stacy took a trip to Colorado, they realized that Wichita had the potential to grow in the craft beer industry. So the business planning began to open a small taproom with the intent to distribute in the Wichita area. After going through several different names, Torrey noticed a small garden gnome and thought of the name, "hopping" for the hops in the beer, and gnomes who are known for drinking.

Hopping Gnome Brewing officially opened May 29, 2015. Torrey was able to leave his job to brew and run the business full time by that fall. Stacy works full time at Zernco, Inc, while supporting the brewery's business development, marketing, and events. The brewery, which is located in the Douglas Design District, also employs several staff to help run the taproom and attend events.

Torrey, who is from Lyons, and Stacy, a Wichita native, met while attending Fort Hays State University. They share a passion for the Buy Local movement and often partner with other businesses and food trucks in the community. In addition, they participate in local charitable events.

Hopping Gnome Brewing Company's mission is simple; to brew a variety of craft beers with high quality ingredients to make the finest hand crafted ales. By visiting their taproom or sharing a growler with family and friends, you are now part of the Wichita craft beer revolution!

Michael O'Donnell was elected to the Wichita City Council in April 2011 and has served as a Kansas State Senator since 2013. During his tenure in the Kansas State Senate, O'Donnell has served on multiple senate committees including Regulatory Board and Commissions, Ways and Means, Education Budget and Ethics and Elections. He is a graduate of Friends University with a degree in political science and currently serves as the chairman of the Sedgwick County Young Republicans club. O'Donnell is on the board of the Wichita YMCA and Grace Baptist Church and is active as a volunteer in numerous community events.



In 2001, Tim Norton was elected to the Sedgwick County Commission and has served in this capacity since. Prior, he served on the Haysville City Council from 1987 to 1996 and as mayor of Haysville from 1996 to 2000. In 1999, following an F-5 tornado which struck his community, Norton decided to dedicate his life full-time to public service. This decision followed 22 years in the business world managing Target stores.

Norton has served on numerous municipal and county commissions and boards, including charitable organizations. He holds a bachelor of science degree in journalism from Arkansas State University and a masters degree in adult education from Newman University. Tim and his wife, Susan, are long-time Haysville residents and have five grown children.
