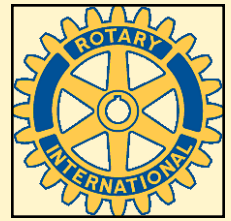

Chase Koch is president of Koch Agronomic Services, LLC; a subsidiary of Koch Ag & Energy Solutions, LLC.

In the mid-1990s, Mr. Koch began a series of summer jobs working for various Koch companies. Following graduation from Texas A&M University in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in business marketing, he worked in Texas for a consulting firm. In 2003, he returned to Wichita as a financial analyst for the Koch Equity Development Group.

In 2006, he joined Koch Nitrogen Company, serving in regional management and global supply positions and later served as senior vice president of Koch Agronomic Services, LLC. He also served as vice president of International Business and most recently, president of Koch Fertilizer, LLC.

Mr. Koch serves as a board member of Koch Industries, Inc., the Charles Koch Foundation and is on the board of directors for The Fertilizer Institute.

Redler speaks regularly to entrepreneurship and marketing organizations and serves on many restaurant and higher-educational boards including the National Restaurant Association, Kansas Restaurant & Hospitality Association, Wichita State University Presidents Council, and Butler Community College Hospitality Management. He also serves and supports many philanthropic boards in the local Wichita community, including the Wichita Children's Home and the Sedgwick County Zoo.

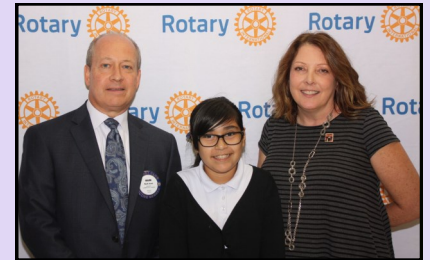

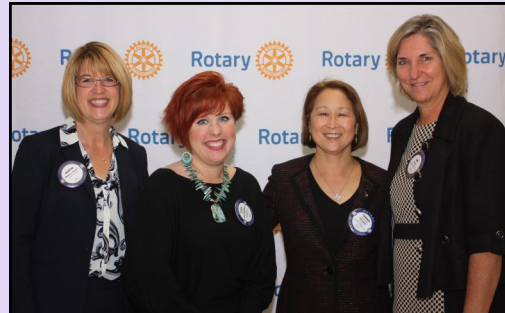
MEETING NOTES — OCTOBER 31, 2016
