

**Topic: Mark Arts Center Update**



Karla Fazio and Katy Dorrah will share an exciting update on the progress of the Mark Arts facility under construction at the southwest corner of 13th Street and Rock Road. Formerly the Wichita Center for the Arts, Mark Arts will expand opportunities for arts education in the Wichita area, including new programming, more accessibility and additional classroom and exhibit space. The center will honor the memory of Mary Koch, who was a lifetime champion of the arts in the Wichita community.

Karla Fazio serves as president of the Mark Arts board of trustees. She has served on the board since 2010, having also been involved with Mark Arts' volunteer group, Designing Women, since 2006 and as an art student. A native of California, Karla and her family have called Wichita home for the past thirteen years. In that time, Karla retired from practicing law and has focused her efforts on raising her daughter and on philanthropy. She has served on the board of the following nonprofits - Youth Entrepreneurs, Junior League of Wichita, Junior Achievement of Wichita, Friends of the Wichita Art Museum, Wichita Bar Association Auxiliary and also currently serves on the board of the Wichita Grand Opera. Karla is passionate about the arts and its positive impact on youth and the community. In her free time, Karla enjoys running and hopes to complete her 25<sup>th</sup> marathon this fall.



Katy Dorrah began at Mark Arts on December 1, 2014 as their executive director. Prior to joining Mark Arts she was the vice president of resource development for United Way of the Plains. During her 20 years at United Way she helped to raise \$235 million for their annual campaigns. She also developed new affinity groups designed to create long-term relationships and increased giving. Katy was the president of Junior League of Wichita in 2011-2012 when the League launched a new cookbook that sold 6,600 copies, raised a record amount at Holiday Galleria and enjoyed a significant increase in membership. Katy holds a bachelor of science degree from Kansas State University.

**President & CEO of the Kansas Leadership Center**

**Topic: The Kansas Leadership Center and Civic Engagement**



The titles "president" and "CEO" may conjure up traditional notions of authoritarian leadership, but Ed O'Malley, who holds those titles at the Kansas Leadership Center, doesn't see them that way. O'Malley spent four years as a state legislator, with a ringside seat for both effective and ineffective displays of civic leadership. To him, leadership is not a title, personality trait or workshop topic. Instead, it's an opportunity that people can grasp and choose to exercise in many different ways and venues. As president and CEO of the Kansas Leadership Center located in Wichita, O'Malley leads a first-of-its-kind training center charged with fostering largescale civic leadership for healthier communities.

O'Malley holds a bachelor's degree in history from Kansas State University and has completed leadership courses at Harvard Business School and Harvard University John F. Kennedy School of Government. He is the co-author of the book *For the Common Good: Redefining Civic Leadership* published in 2013.

### ROTARY DISTRICT 5690 SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE



Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 are being offered by our Rotary District 5690 to high school and college students. All high school and college students are eligible to apply, including those related to Rotarians. The recipients will be selected based upon their educational goals and achievements, financial need and letters of reference. Please visit the [district website](#) for instructions and a downloadable application. **Applications are due Feb 15, 2017** and the awards will be announced on March 15.

In addition, our district will provide a full scholarship for one student from each club to attend RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) camp in May, 2017. RYLA is a leadership camp most beneficial for high school students before their junior or senior year. It is held annually on the Southwestern College campus in Winfield.
